**11.2.1 Proposals for new and amended postgraduate courses****11.2.1.1 Faculty of Arts**

**(1) Master of Liberal Studies, Graduate Diploma in Liberal Studies, Graduate Certificate in Liberal Studies**

The Faculty of Arts has submitted a proposal to delete the existing Master of Liberal Studies, Graduate Diploma in Liberal Studies and Graduate Certificate in Liberal Studies courses.

The Faculty wishes to delete these courses as the academic co-ordinating the courses has left the University, and the level of enrolments is in decline.

**11.2.1.2 Faculty of Dentistry: Master of Dental Science (Community Oral Health and Epidemiology), Master of Dental Science (Endodontics), Master of Dental Science (Oral and Maxillo-facial Surgery), Graduate Diploma in Clinical Dentistry (Advanced Practice), Graduate Diploma in Community Oral Health and Epidemiology**

The Faculty of Dentistry has submitted a proposal to delete the Master of Dental Science (Community Oral Health and Epidemiology), Master of Dental Science (Endodontics), Master of Dental Science (Oral and Maxillo-facial Surgery), Graduate Diploma in Clinical Dentistry (Advanced Practice) and Graduate Diploma in Community Oral Health and Epidemiology courses.

The majority of these courses have not been offered by the Faculty for some years (mainly due to a lack of academic and administrative resources). In the case of the Master of Dental Science (Community Oral Health and Epidemiology) and the Graduate Diploma in Community Oral Health and Epidemiology, the Faculty is proposing to replace these courses with a new doctoral program. Additionally, three dental elective units of study (Preventive Dentistry, Population Oral Health, and Dental Health Services) will be offered by the School of Public Health, Faculty of Medicine to candidates of the Master of Public Health or the Master of International Public Health.

**11.2.2.1 Faculty of Architecture, Design & Planning – English Language Requirements**

The Faculty of Architecture, Design and Planning seeks to alter the English language requirements for entry to its graduate courses.

The University policy document *Postgraduate English Language Requirements* specifies the Faculty requirement as:

- TOEFL – 600 or better plus TWE at 4.5+
- IELTS – overall band score of 7.0 or better, with no component being below 6.5

At its meeting of 22 September, 2004 the Faculty approved the following revised requirement:

- For students without a Bachelor's Degree from an English language university, and who have studied less than two years in an institution of English instruction, an IELTS score of a minimum average 7.0 with no section below 6.0 must be provided.

The Faculty seeks the Academic Board's approval to replace the old Faculty-specific information with the latest criteria.

**Recommendation**

*That the Academic Board amend Appendix 1 of the policy "Postgraduate English Language Requirements", as set out in the report presented.*

**11.2.2.2 Faculty of Dentistry – English Language Requirements**

The Faculty of Dentistry recommends through the Graduate Studies Committee that the Academic Board approve the amendment of appendix one of the policy *Postgraduate English Language Requirements* to provide for requirements above the University minimum for postgraduate students in clinical coursework programs (Master of Dental Science in Oral Medicine and Oral Pathology, Orthodontics, Paediatric Dentistry, Periodontics, Prosthodontics) as these students are required frequently to converse with patients, teaching and hospital staff and write consultation reports to external clinicians.

The recommended requirements for these postgraduate candidates are:

- (1) IELTS 7 (change from 6.5) with no band below 6.0 or
- (2) TOEFL 600 (change from 577) plus TWE 4.5 or
- (3) Computer-based TOEFL 250 (change from 233) with an Essay Rating of 4.5.

The amendments to Appendix One are set out in the following pages, additions are indicated by underlining.

#### **MASTER OF DENTAL SCIENCE**

#### **1 Requirements for the Master of Dental Science**

- 1.1 To qualify for the award of the Master of Dental Science a student must:
- 1.1.1 successfully complete units of study giving credit for a total of 144 credit points; and
  - 1.1.2 satisfy the requirements of all other relevant by-laws, rules and resolutions of the University.

#### **2 Streams**

- 2.1 The Master of Dental Science will be awarded in the following streams:

#### **3 Requirements for the honours degree**

- 3.1 To qualify for the award of the honours degree a student must complete the honours requirements published in the Faculty Resolutions relating to the course.

(2) Sections 4 – 12 of these Senate Resolutions for the Degree of Master of Dental Science only apply when the degree is taken in disciplines (a), (b), (c), (d), (e), (g) and (h) in section 2.  
(3) The Faculty Resolutions for the Degree of Master of Dental Science apply when the degree is taken in discipline (f) in section 2.~~

- ~~4. (1) An applicant for admission to candidature for the degree of Master of Dental Science shall:~~
- ~~(a) except as provided in subsection (2) be a Bachelor of Dental Surgery of the University of Sydney;~~
  - ~~(b) apply in writing to the Faculty for such admission to candidature and for the approval of the Faculty;~~
  - ~~(c) have completed at least two years' general dental practice experience; and~~
  - ~~(d) in the cases of disciplines (a), (b), (d) and (e) in section 2, unless exempted by the Faculty, have satisfactorily completed the primary Fellowship Examination of the Royal Australasian College of Dental Surgeons, or its equivalent.~~
- ~~(2) A graduate in dentistry of another university or a candidate with equivalent qualifications obtained in an appropriate institution may, with the approval of the Faculty, be admitted to candidature for the degree.~~
- ~~(3) The Faculty may admit an applicant to candidature on probation for a period not exceeding twelve months and at the end of that period shall review the work of the candidate and confirm or terminate the candidature.~~
- ~~(4) A candidate admitted to candidature on probation whose candidature is subsequently confirmed shall be deemed to have commenced candidature on the day of admission to candidature on probation.~~
- ~~5. A candidate for the degree shall:~~
- ~~(1) unless exempted by the Faculty, pass an examination prescribed by the Faculty, within the first year, and not less than one year before complying with section 9(1);~~

- 11.2 A student whose candidature has lapsed must apply for re-admission in accordance with procedures determined by the faculty.

## **12 Satisfactory progress**

- 12.1 The faculty may
  - 12.1.1 on the recommendation of the head of the discipline concerned, call upon any

- candidate to show cause why that candidature should not be terminated by reason of unsatisfactory progress towards completion of either degree; and
- 12.1.2 where, in the opinion of the Faculty, the candidate does not show good cause, terminate the candidature.

**13 Credit**

- 13.1 Refer to *University of Sydney (Coursework) Rule 2000 (as amended)*, Division 3, Section 8 and the Board of Postgraduate Studies for the Faculties of Dentistry, Medicine and Pharmacy, *Academic Credit, Advanced Standing, and Exemption Policy*.
- 13.2 A candidate may receive credit, as recommended by the Head of Discipline, towards the requirements for the Graduate Certificate in Clinical Dentistry where:
- 13.2.1 before admission, the candidate has spent time in graduate study in the University of Sydney or another university, and
- 13.2.2 the candidate has completed coursework, within five years except with the permission of the dean, considered by the dean to be equivalent to work prescribed for the award course.

**14 Time limits**

- 14.1 A full-time candidate must complete the requirements for the course not earlier than one semester after the commencement of candidature and, except with the permission of the Faculty on the recommendation of the head of the discipline concerned, not later than one year after commencement of candidature.

**15 Examination**

- 15.1 The Head of Discipline shall report the result of the examination of the coursework and other work, if any, to the faculty which shall determine the results of the candidature.

#### **Master of Applied Nuclear Science and Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science**

These Resolutions must be read in conjunction with the University of Sydney (Coursework) Rule 2000 (as amended), which sets out the requirements for all coursework courses, and the relevant Resolutions of the Senate.

#### **1 Requirements for the Master of Applied Nuclear Science**

- 1.1 To qualify for the award of the Master of Applied Nuclear Science a student must:
  - 1.1.1 complete successfully units of study giving credit for a total of 72 credit points, selected from units of study approved for the Master of Applied Nuclear Science;
  - 1.1.2 satisfy the requirements of all other relevant By-Laws, Rules and Resolutions of the University.

#### **2 Requirements for the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science**

- 2.1 To qualify for the award of the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science a student must:
  - 2.1.1 complete successfully units of study giving credit for a total of 48 credit points, selected from units of study approved for the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science;
  - 2.1.2 satisfy the requirements of all other relevant By-Laws, Rules and Resolutions of the University.

## Amendment of the Resolutions of the Faculty

### Master of Applied Nuclear Science and Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science

*These Resolutions must be read in conjunction with the University of Sydney (Coursework) Rule 2000 (as amended), which sets out the requirements for all coursework courses, and the relevant Resolutions of the Senate.*

#### 1 Admission

- 1.1 The Dean of the Faculty of Science may, on the recommendation of the Head of the School of Physics, admit to candidature for:
  - 1.1.1 the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science:
  - 1.1.2 an applicant who is the holder of a bachelor's degree in Science or Engineering from the University of Sydney provided the applicant has achieved a major in physics, or equivalent;
  - 1.1.3 a graduate of another university or appropriate institution who has equivalent qualifications to those specified in 1.1.2.
- 1.2 the Master of Applied Nuclear Science
  - 1.2.1 a person who has the qualifications specified in subsection 1.1.2; or
  - 1.2.2 a person who has completed requirements for the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science.
- 1.3 Conditions of candidature are prescribed by Resolutions of the Faculty.

#### 2 Units of study

- 2.1 The units of study for the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science and Master in Applied Nuclear Science are listed in the table below.
- 2.2 Credit point value, assumed knowledge, corequisites, prerequisites and any special conditions are included in the description of units of study.

#### 3 Requirements for the Graduate Diploma and Master in Applied Nuclear Science

- 3.1 A candidate for the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science shall complete coursework to the value of 48 credit points comprising all units of study designated for this program as detailed in the table above, excluding the project PHYS5019.

- 3.2 A candidate for the Master in Applied Nuclear Science shall complete coursework to the value of 72 credit points comprising all units of study designated for this program as detailed in the table above, including the project PHYS5019.

#### **4 Details of units of study**

- 4.1 The units of study for the Graduate Diploma and Master in Nuclear Science are listed in the table in sub-section 2 above. The units of study may be varied by the Faculty from time to time.
- 4.2 A candidate for the course shall proceed by completing units of study as prescribed by the Faculty.
- 4.3 A unit of study shall consist of such lectures, seminars, tutorial instruction, essays, exercises, practical work, or project work as may be prescribed.
- 4.4 In these resolutions, 'to complete a unit of study' or any derivative expression means:
- 4.4.1 to attend the lectures and the meetings, if any, for seminars or tutorial instruction;
  - 4.4.2 to complete satisfactorily the essays, exercises, practical and project work if any; and
  - 4.4.3 to pass any other examination of the unit of study that may apply.
- 4.5 All units of study for a particular subject area may not be available every semester.

#### **5 Enrolment in more/less than minimum load**

- 5.1 A candidate may proceed on a full-time or part-time basis.

#### **6 Cross-institutional study**

- 6.1 Cross-institutional study shall not be available to students enrolled in the Graduate Diploma and Master in Applied Nuclear Science except where the University of Sydney has a formal Cooperation Agreement with another University.

#### **7 Restrictions on enrolment**

- 7.1 Admission to the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science and Master of Applied Nuclear Science may be limited by a quota.
- 7.2 In determining the quota, the University will take into account:
- 7.2.1 availability of resources including space, laboratory and computing facilities; and
  - 7.2.2 availability of adequate and appropriate supervision.
- 7.3 In considering an application for admission to candidature the Dean shall take account of the quota and will select, in preference, applicants who are most meritorious in terms of subsection 1 above.

#### **8 Discontinuation of enrolment**

- 8.1 A student who does not enrol in any semester without first obtaining written permission from the Dean to suspend candidature will be deemed to have discontinued enrolment in the course.
- 8.2 Students who have discontinued from the course will be required to apply for admission to the course and be subject to admission requirements pertaining at that time.

#### **9 Suspension of candidature**

- 9.1 A student may seek written permission from the Dean to suspend candidature in the course.
- 9.2 Suspension may be granted for a maximum of one year.

#### **10 Re-enrolment after an absence**

- 10.1 A student who plans to re-enrol after a period of suspension must advise the Faculty of Science Office in writing of their intention by no later than the end of October for

First Semester of the following year or the end of May for Second Semester of the same year.

## **11 Satisfactory progress**

11.1 Candidates for the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science and the Master of Applied Nuclear Science shall be governed by the rules as follows:

11.1.1 A student who has failed a cumulative total of 12cp at any stage of enrolment in the Master of Applied Nuclear Science will be required to show good cause why he or she should be allowed to re-enrol and, if good cause has not been established, the student's enrolment will be transferred to the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science;

11.1.2 A student who has failed a cumulative total of 18cp at any stage of enrolment in the Master of Applied Nuclear Science and/or the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science will be required to show good cause why he or she should be allowed to re-enrol and, if good cause has not been established, the student will not be permitted to re-enrol.

11.1.3 A student who has failed a unit at the second attempt in the Master of Applied Nuclear Science and/or Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science will be deemed to have failed to complete course requirements and will be required to show good cause why he or she should be allowed to re-enrol. If good cause has not been established, the student will not be permitted to re-enrol.

## **12 Time limit**

12.1 A candidate for the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science shall complete the requirements for the award in a minimum of two semesters and a maximum of 6 semesters, and (in the event of suspension) except with permission of the Dean within five calendar years of admission to candidature.

12.2 A candidate for the Master in Applied Nuclear Science shall complete the requirements for the award in a minimum of 3 semesters and a maximum of 6 semesters, and (in the event of suspension) except with permission of the Dean within five calendar years of admission to candidature.

## **13 Assessment policy**

13.1 A candidate may be tested by written and oral examinations, assignments, exercises and practical work or any combination of these.

13.2 On completion of the requirements for the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science or the Master in Applied Nuclear Science, the results of the examination of the coursework shall be reported by the School of Physics to the Faculty, which shall determine the result of the candidature.

## **14 Credit transfer policy**

14.1 Credit is not available in the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science and the Master of Applied Nuclear Science for postgraduate study which has not been undertaken in these award courses within the previous three years.

14.2 A candidate who has qualified for the award of the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science may transfer, within three years, to the Master of Applied Nuclear Science and receive credit for up to 48 credit points from the Graduate Diploma in Applied Nuclear Science.
