10.2.1 Proposals for New and Amended Courses**10.2.1.1 Faculty of Arts****(1) Transfer of Courses from the Faculty of Economics and Business** *E5-E21*

In 2006, the Provost authorised a review of Social Sciences at the University of Sydney. As a result of this review, the Departments of Government and International Relations and Political Economy will be transferred from the Faculty of Economics and Business to the Faculty of Arts from 1 January 2008, and the following degrees will be transferred to the Faculty of Arts:

- Bachelor of Economic and Social Sciences
- Bachelor of International Studies
- Bachelor of Economic and Social Sciences and Bachelor of Laws
- Bachelor of International Studies and Bachelor of Laws

Recommendation

That the Academic Board:

- (1) *approve the proposal from the Faculty of Arts to transfer the Bachelor of Economic and Social Sciences, Bachelor of International Studies, Bachelor of Economic and Social Sciences/Bachelor of Laws, and Bachelor of International Studies/Bachelor of Laws, to the Faculty of Arts,*
- (2) *recommend that Senate:*
 - (a) *endorse the Academic Board's approval of the transfer of these courses to the Faculty of Arts from the Faculty of Economics and Business; and*
 - (b) *approve the amendment of the Resolutions of Senate relating to the list of degrees, diplomas and certificates in the Faculty of Arts, the list of degrees, diplomas and certificates in the Faculty of Economics and Business, and relating to these courses,*
- (3) *note the amendment of the Faculty Resolutions relating to these courses*
with effect from 1 January 2008, as set out in the report.

(2) Undergraduate Courses – Amendment to Majors*E22-E24*

In addition to the transfer of courses mentioned in the item above, there are two majors which will also be transferred from the Faculty of Economics and Business to the Faculty of Arts:

- Government and International Relations; and
- Political Economy.

The Faculty of Arts is also seeking to amend the names of two majors as follows:

- Indonesian and Malay Studies – to become Indonesian Studies; and
- Spanish – to become Spanish and Latin American Studies.

Recommendation

That the Academic Board:

- (1) *approve the proposal from the Faculty of Arts to amend the list of majors for its undergraduate courses,*
- (2) *recommend that Senate endorse the Academic Board's approval of the amendment of the list of majors noting that there is no amendment of Resolutions of Senate; and*

10.2.1.2 Faculty of Economics and Business: Bachelor of International Studies, (Major in Human Geography) E8-E9, E12-E13

The Committee received a proposal from the Faculty of Economics and Business to incorporate Human Geography units of study from the Faculty of Sciences (Geosciences School) into the Bachelor of International Studies degree course. Units of study are optional and can be taken as electives or as part of the new major in Human Geography.

Recommendation

- (2) *recommend that Senate*

4.3 To qualify for the award of the honours degree a student must complete successfully an additional year of study (the honours year), as specified in the Faculty of ~~Economics and Business~~ Arts Handbook.

4.4 To enrol in the honours year, a student must satisfy the following:

- 4.4.1 successful completion of the requirements for the pass degree;

4.4.2 confirmation of the student's eligibility for entry to the honours year from the relevant Discipline(s) / Department; and

4.4.3 any other requirements for entry into the honours year set by the relevant Discipline(s)/Department and the Faculty of ~~Economics and Business Arts~~, unless otherwise approved by the Faculty of ~~Economics and Business Arts~~.
