



Attendance: Postgraduate Courses

1. At its meeting of 21 November 1991, the Academic Board adopted the following definition of full-time candidature:

A full-time postgraduate degree or diploma student is expected to devote a 35 hour working week to study towards the degree or diploma. Attendance at the University for all those hours may not be necessary, although the candidate must attend required lectures, seminars and supervisory sessions and undertake appropriate research work.

2. At its meeting of 20 June 1994, the Academic Board noted that the Committee for Graduate Studies had agreed that the two semesters which candidates had to complete within the University could be completed as a number of substantial blocks of time and that candidates did not necessarily have to spend an entire semester at a time within the University.
