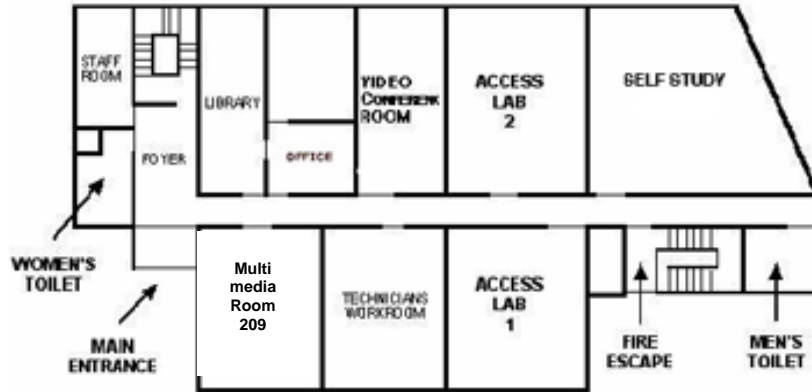


Where is the Self Study room?




How can I access AV digital recordings from the computers?

** also available from the Access Labs under Media Master*



Choosing a file

1. Double-click on the **Language Player**  icon on the desktop.
2. Click on the 'Open folder' icon (underneath **Master Track**).
3. Select a language folder (e.g. French), & media file (e.g. **Videos** folder).
4. The file will play automatically when downloaded (takes up to a minute).

Recording audio in the Student Track

1. Click **Record** and begin speaking into the microphone.
2. Click **Stop** to end the recording.
3. Wait for a few seconds while your new audio file is being processed.

Play

1. Click **Play** to play the file loaded into the Student Track.
2. You may **Pause**, **Stop**, **Recap**, **Rewind**, or **Fast Forward**.

Saving Files

Once you have recorded a new file in the Student Track, you can save the file to your USB by clicking on **Save**.

Simultaneous Recording

To record your voice in the Student Track while simultaneously listening to a media file in the Master Track,

1. Click on the Combined Track's **Record** button. This action would start the Master Track playing and the Student Track recording.
2. To initiate simultaneous playback and recording, click **Record** on the Combined Track. To end simultaneous playback and recording, click **Stop**.

How can I use the Audio tape recorders?

The audio tape recorders are different from normal cassette recorders. The teaching programme is recorded on the top half of the tape. The bottom half is reserved for you to record your voice.

This means that when you use the cassette, you should press the **RECORD** button. You can then record your own voice in imitation of the original voice. You may also **STOP** to **REWIND** the tape to any point. Then, by pressing the **PLAY** button, you can not only hear the original voice again (on the top half of the tape), but your voice as well (on the bottom half of the tape).

Detailed instructions can be found next to the equipment for more information.

How can I view Satellite TV from the computers?

1. Click on **VLC Media Player** on the desktop.
2. Click on **View → Playlist → SAF → Usyd Meta**, choose your desired channel, & double-click to play.

Some cassettes, CDs, & DVDs are kept in the Library. Please ask the Librarian should you wish to use them.

How can I view foreign language movies from the computers?

1. Click on **Language Media** on the desktop
2. Select a language folder (e.g. French), & **Videos** folder.
3. Double-click on any movie to play.
