Glocalising Sex and Gender: Consumption, Culture, Practice

The central aim of the workshop is to bring together new work with a specific and innovative interest in how contemporary gendered and sexual cultures are produced by local, inter- and trans-national contexts of consumption and production. The relationship between globalisation, transnationalism and queer theory-politics, and feminist theory-politics, has already been critically established, though often in mutually exclusive ways. This master class will continue in the vein of transnational study, with a focus on the concrete ways in which glocalised gendered and sexual effects are produced. As well as staff from the Department of Gender and Cultural Studies we have two international speakers:

Dr. Ulrika Dhal (Sodertorn University, Sweden): workshop on feminist methodologies, representation, and working from within your own community.

Prof. Chengzhou He (Nanjing University, China): plenary on feminism and China.
