Honours



What is honours?

Many degrees at the University of Sydney can be awarded 'with honours'. Depending on the faculty, graduate students can apply to study for an additional, research-based honours year after they complete their bachelor's degree. However, other faculties award honours automatically to students who have excelled throughout their undergraduate studies, so an honours year is not available as a graduate option in those faculties.

The following faculties offer an additional honours year:

- Arts
- Architecture, Design and Planning
- Economics and Business
- Health Sciences
- Engineering and Information Technologies
- Science
- Sydney College of the Arts (Visual Arts).

Why do honours?

Honours can add the 'finishing touch' to a bachelor's degree, improving career prospects or allowing you to pursue your passion. Honours can also provide the gateway to further academic research, such as a PhD.

How do I apply?

Gaining entry to an honours year is competitive. This is because, while many honours candidates started their undergraduate degree at Sydney, we also accept honours candidates from other institutions*.

The application process varies between faculties. In some cases you will be asked to submit a thesis proposal. We will then assign you a supervisor, who will help you refine your topic and approach. If you completed your undergraduate degree at another institution, you will also be required to apply for 'honours conversion'.

* Only University of Sydney students and alumni are eligible to study for honours in the Faculty of Health Sciences.

How much does it cost?

For domestic students (Australian and New Zealand citizens, Australian permanent residents and those on a humanitarian visa), an honours year is Commonwealth supported. This means that you share the cost of your education with the federal government. If you are an Australian citizen, your student contribution can then be deferred via HECS-HELP and repaid after you graduate.

What scholarships are available?

The University of Sydney offers 100 Honours Scholarships to domestic students every year. Each scholarship is worth \$6000 annually.

Honours Scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic merit and personal attributes such as leadership and creativity.

To apply you should obtain an application form from the Scholarships and Prizes Office in August and submit it by December in the year before you begin your honours program. For details see www.usyd.edu.au/scholarships/current/scholarships/current_opportunities.shtml

Graduate entry



What is graduate entry?

Graduate-entry courses are bachelor's degrees that require you to have already completed another undergraduate degree. They typically result in a qualification that you need to enter a profession such as medicine or law.

The graduate-entry courses offered at Sydney are:

- Bachelor of Laws
- Bachelor of Medicine/Bachelor of Surgery
- Bachelor of Dentistry
- Bachelor of Teaching.

The University of Sydney also offers a number of graduate-entry master's degrees. You must have completed an undergraduate degree to be eligible for these courses, but unlike some specialist master's degrees (see postgraduate coursework on page 8), your undergraduate degree can be from any discipline. Some graduate-entry master's courses include:

- Master of Nursing
- Graduate entry master's programs in Health Sciences
- Master of Commerce
- Master of Pharmacy.

Why do graduate entry?

Graduate-entry courses are, in some cases, necessary pathways to your chosen career. In many cases, they also enable you to obtain the knowledge and qualifications required to change careers.

How do I apply?

Bachelor of Laws

You should apply through the Universities Admissions Centre (www.uac.edu.au) by 30 September 2009. Late applications will be accepted, subject to payment of an additional cost.

Bachelor of Medicine/Bachelor of Surgery and Bachelor of Dentistry

You apply for these programs through the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER). There are specific admissions criteria, including the Graduate Australian Medical Schools Admissions Test (GAMSAT). The admissions cycle for these programs begins in April so plan early.

Bachelor of Teaching

You should apply directly to the Faculty of Education and Social Work. For more information, visit www.edsw.usyd.edu.au/future_students/postgraduate/mteach

Other graduate-entry courses

Other faculties also offer graduate-entry courses that encourage cross-disciplinary work and meet many objectives, from professional development to academic specialisation. How much does it cost?

All graduate-entry bachelor's degrees are Commonwealth supported for domestic students. This means the cost of your degree is shared with the federal government and Australian citizens can defer their contribution through HECS-HELP.

Graduate-entry master's programs are generally full-fee paying. These costs can be deferred through the federal government's FEE-HELP scheme.

What scholarships are available?

Postgraduate research



What is postgraduate research?

Postgraduate research refers to research-based degrees such as a PhD or master's by research. Due to the specialised study involved, they typically take longer to complete than other graduate options.

Why do a research degree?

Sydney research students join a community producing groundbreaking work across a wide range of disciplines in the areas critical to our common future. A research degree from a world-class university like Sydney can take you to new heights. For example, it can lead to wide recognition of your research and open doors to academia or leadership roles in a variety of areas.

Studying for a PhD at Sydney will allow you to pursue your interests under the guidance of an experienced supervisor, many of whom are leaders in their field.

How do I apply?

Applying for a research course is a four-step process:

1. Academic qualifications

To apply for a PhD at the University of Sydney, you must have completed an Australian honours degree, a master's by research degree or a master's by coursework program with a minor thesis component.

2. Find a supervisor

The University of Sydney provides an online portal, 'Find a research supervisor', that lists all University research projects currently accepting new students. Go to www.usyd.edu.au/research/opportunities to search through more than 1100 research projects, read about supervisors' areas of interest and expertise, and make initial contact with them.

3. Initial research proposal

After finding a potential supervisor, you must develop and submit an initial research proposal. The supervisor will read and comment on your proposal, and indicate if they are willing to supervise you before you submit your application. Your proposal should be no longer than 500 words.

4. Submit application

Once you have refined your research proposal, you must complete an application form available from www.usyd.edu.au/future_students/domestic_postgraduate_research/admissions/how_to_apply.shtml and submit it to the relevant faculty office.

How much does it cost?

Research degrees are free of charge for domestic students. This is because the Research Training Scheme (RTS) provides HECS exemptions for Commonwealth-funded higher degree research students. Domestic PhD students are therefore fully funded by the Australian Government and can commit to their research without financial burden.

What scholarships are available?

Research students can benefit from many different scholarships and opportunities, including travel. The University's Research Office provides the most up-to-date information about scholarships, awards and grants-in-aid for postgraduate research students. Postgraduate coursework



What is postgraduate coursework?

Postgraduate coursework is the term used to describe a program that leads to an award such as a graduate certificate, graduate diploma, or master's degree. Entry to a postgraduate coursework program usually requires prior completion of a relevant undergraduate degree (or diploma).

Coursework programs consist of units of study rather than research work and usually require attendance at lectures and tutorials.

Why do postgraduate coursework?

There are many reasons:

Professional development and accreditation

Coursework degrees can allow you to develop your knowledge and expertise, either for accreditation and continuing professional development purposes, or to help you further your career.

Postgraduate education involves close collaboration with the relevant profession and industries, with a focus on developing skills and versatility for

professional employment and helping you rise to the responsibility of leadership. The University uses its links with business and research teams to provide the most up-to-date and relevant information to coursework students, and we develop our courses in consultation with relevant professional associations. Some faculties also provide exclusive programs for members of professional associations.

Career change

Like graduate-entry courses, postgraduate coursework degrees can help you change your career direction without having to study for another bachelor's degree.

The University also offers a number of courses for students who have not had any previous training in a particular area. These courses allow you to pursue relevant postgraduate coursework study and begin your new career.

Personal interest

Postgraduate coursework study allows you to study a course related to a hobby or other interest, even if you don't intend to pursue a career in that field. We offer courses in a wide variety of areas, including creative writing, music, foreign languages, environmental science, and more.

How do I apply?

The application process and entry requirements vary for each faculty. You should check directly with the faculty that interests you, as you may have to apply directly to the faculty or through an external body such as the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER) or the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC).

How much does it cost?

Study now, pay later with the federal government's FEE-HELP scheme.

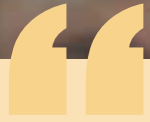
Postgraduate coursework programs are full-fee paying courses that can be paid up front or deferred through FEE-HELP and paid later through the taxation system. The 2010 fees for each postgraduate coursework degree can be found on pages 10 to 15.

What scholarships are available?

There are no University-funded scholarships for postgraduate coursework students, but some faculties may provide scholarships. Many industry organisations and businesses are also willing to contribute towards tuition fees for professional development courses.

The University's Scholarships and Prizes Office often has information about scholarships provided by external parties (see www.usyd.edu.au/scholarships/postgrad for details).

Postgraduate course guide

All fees are presented per one Equivalent Full Time Study Load (EFTSL). An EFTSL is a standard annual full time load and at the University of Sydney and is equivalent to 48 credit points. If students are studying more or less than one EFTSL, their fee will increase or decrease proportionally.

To calculate fees for your course, you must multiply the EFTSL cost by the duration of the course. For example, the Master of Human Rights and Democratisation takes 60 credit points (1.25 EFTSL) to complete and the cost for one EFTSL is \$13,200 (domestic) and \$19,200 (international). Therefore, if all 60 credit points are to be completed in

2010, the cost for the Master of Human Rights and Democratisation equals 1.25 x 13,200, which is \$16,500 for domestic students and 1.25 x 19,200, which is \$24,000 for international students. Likewise, the Graduate Certificate in Applied Science (Environmental Science) takes 24 credit points (0.5 EFTSL) to complete and the cost for one EFTSL is \$16,800 (domestic) and \$28,800 (international). Therefore, the cost for the Graduate Certificate in Applied Science (Environmental Science) equals 0.5 x 16,800, which is \$8,400 for domestic students and 0.5 x 28,800, which is \$14,400 for international students.

Above fee rates are applicable only if

a course is completed within the same calendar year, as they are subject to annual review and may change in the future years.

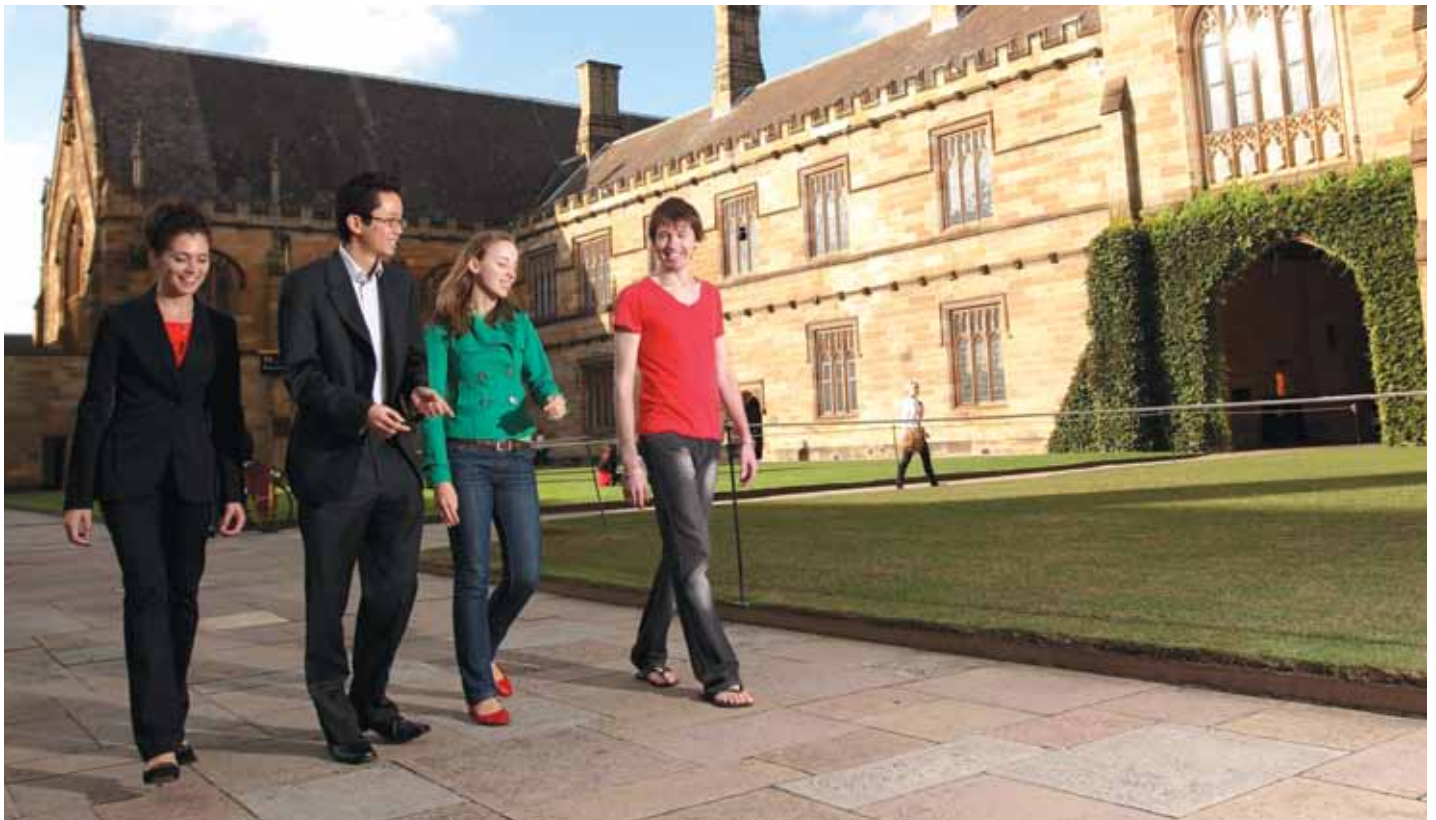
