Robert Frykenberg is Professor Emeritus of History and South Asian Studies at the University of Wisconsin in Madison. He is widely regarded as the leading world authority on the history of Christianity in India, and since the early 1990s has explored the political uses of Hinduism in India.

His publications as author and editor include *Guntur District, 1788-1848: A History of Local Influence and Central Authority* (1965), *Land Control and Social Structure in Indian History* (1969), *Land Tenure and Peasant in South Asia* (1977), *Delhi Through the Ages* (1986), *History and Belief: The Foundations of Historical Understanding* (1996), *Christians, Cultural Interactions and India's Religious Traditions* (2002), *Christians and Missionaries in India: Cross-Cultural Communication since 1500* (2003); *Tirunelveli's Evangelical Christians: Two Centuries of Family Vamsâvali Traditions* (2003), *Pandita Ramabai's America: A Translation from Marathi of her A Condition of Life in the United States, 1889* (2003), and *Christianity in India: From Beginnings to Present* (2008).
