Tendor is the Executive Director of Students for a Free Tibet (SFT), an international grassroots organization working for Tibetan freedom and human rights. Born and raised in Tibetan refugee communities in India, Tendor joined SFT in 1999 as a student at Brown University and has published articles in well known magazines and newspapers.



Dr. Simon Bradshaw is the Campaign Coordinator for the Australia Tibet Council. He has previously worked on environment and development projects in Australia, India and on his home island of Guernsey. In 2007 he completed a four-year research project on the traditional relationship between the land and people of Tibet.



Dr Sev Ozdowski is Director of Equity and Diversity at the University of Western Sydney and Adjunct Professor at the Centre for Peace and Conflict Studies, Sydney University. As the Australian Human Rights Commissioner and Disability Discrimination Commissioner (2000-05), Dr Ozdowski authored the ground-breaking report *National Inquiry into Children in Immigration Detention: A Last Resort*.
