#### Notes

- i. For a major in French, students complete 12 credit points in junior English units and 36 credit points in senior English units of study. The units a student completes depends on their level of proficiency in French language. For the major there are three streams based on language proficiency – (1) Introductory – for those with no knowledge, less than two years of French or less than 65 % in Beginners HSC French, (2) Intermediate – for those with less than 80% in French Continuers or more than 65% in Beginners HSC French; (3) Advanced – for those with French Extension or more than 80% in Continuers HSC French. - ii. Students cannot count senior French Studies units to both a major in French Studies and International Business.
- iii. This program of study is meant to be a guide only. Students are able to undertake the required units of study in different sequences to that listed above. Students should note that this example has been developed using 2012 unit of study offerings and there is no guarantee that the units listed will be offered in the same semesters in subsequent years.
- iv. Certain units of study listed above may also be offered in Summer or Winter School sessions.
