The Global Executive MBA is an innovative degree designed specifically for experienced high-performing managers to gain a strong competitive advantage in today's global marketplace.



The Alumni Scholarship for Excellence in Not-for-profit Leadership is intended to promote academic excellence at executive leadership level in the not-for-profit sector.

ELIGIBILITY

The Alumni Scholarship for Excellence in Not-for-profit Leadership is open to domestic students who have successfully gained entry to the Global Executive MBA and are employed by a not-for-profit organisation. All applicants to the Global Executive MBA program are automatically considered for this scholarship. No additional application is required.

SELECTION CRITERIA

One scholarship is available for award each year. The scholarship is awarded to the most outstanding candidate against the degree selection criteria, which include (but are not limited to) the candidate's:

- academic achievement demonstrated in their undergraduate degree

- leadership potential and motivation to achieve
- personal integrity
- performance in the selection interview
- strength of their Statement of Motivation
- ability to gain from successful completion of the degree

Each candidate's performance against these criteria is assessed by an admissions committee made up of:

- the Global Executive MBA Program Director
- the Global Executive MBA Program Coordinator
- a Global Executive MBA module leader

VALUE

The scholarship is valued at \$50,000 and is tenable for the 1.5 year span of the degree.

Each semester of study ordinarily attracts a tuition fee of \$28,080, made up of two units of study at \$14,040 each. The scholarship will be divided into three payments of \$16,667. An instalment will be paid on commencement of the degree and then for two subsequent semesters pending academic progression.

The recipient (or their sponsor company) will still be required to pay:

- the balance of their tuition fees (\$11,413 per semester, over three semesters described above).
- their accommodation, meals and group transport costs (billed at cost) approximately four weeks prior to the commencement of each module
- their return airfare to the host city of each module

SELECTION PROCESS

As part of the Global Executive MBA admissions process all candidates are interviewed by an admissions committee. There is no separate application process for the scholarship.

Once all interviews have been completed, the committee will shortlist candidates and make a recommendation for awarding the scholarship to the Faculty Executive Committee (FEC). In the event that the FEC is unable to agree on who should be awarded the scholarship, a subcommittee will be established and may seek further information from shortlisted candidates to assist in making a decision.

ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS

The scholarship is only tenable in the Global Executive MBA degree program at the University of Sydney Business School.

In the event that the scholarship holder changes degrees or discontinues study, the scholarship will no longer be tenable.

The scholarship must be taken up in the semester in which it is offered. That is, the scholarship holder is not able to defer or suspend their enrolment in the degree and still retain the scholarship.

To retain the scholarship, the holder must maintain a fulltime study load each semester and make reasonable academic progression with at least a 70 percent average each semester.

The scholarship holder will have the opportunity to promote the Global Executive MBA degree for publicity purposes.
