

**Possible Combinations of Majors in the Bachelor of Commerce and Bachelor of Laws 2012 Commencing Students
(exceeding by a maximum of 18 credit points)**

The following table indicates which combinations of majors can be completed in the combined Bachelor of Commerce and Bachelor of Laws degree (first three years) within 162 credit points (144 credit points + an allowed exceeding of requirements by 18 credit points). In this table, 'yes' indicates a combination which fits into the credit point requirement and 'no' indicates where students would need to exceed by more than 18 credit points (usually 24 credit points) in order to meet the requirements of that particular combination of majors.

Accreditations	Professional accreditation in Accounting (CPA)	Students can complete the requirements for CPA within the 144 + 18 (exceeding) credit points (including Accounting major). Students who don't wish to exceed can replace the CLAW units required for CPA with CPA approved replacement LAWS units which are available during the full duration of the Law component of their degree (see handbook for details). Students can only complete one major, Accounting and CPA requirements.										
	Professional accreditation in and ICAI requirements.	Students can complete the requirements for CA within the 144 credit points (including Accounting major) without the need to exceed. Students can only complete one major, Accounting, and ICAI requirements.										
	Australian Computer Society (ACS)	Students can complete the requirements for ACS accreditation without exceeding - completing a major in Business Information Systems only. Students can only complete ACS accreditation requirements (including a BIS major) combined with a major in Finance, International Business or Management and fit within the 144 + 18 (exceeding) credit points.										
	Australian Human Resource Institute accreditation (IR&HRM major)	AHRI accreditation only requires the completion of a major in IR&HRM. Students who complete this major in combination with any major listed as available in the above table can meet accreditation requirements within the 144 + 18 (exceeding) credit points.										
Required Units for Majors	Accounting	Students must complete 1 junior (6 credit points) and 6 senior units (36 credit points) outside of the core units = 7 units (42 credit points). Core units included in this major are: BUSS1030/ACCT1005 and BUSS1020 (or ECMT1010).										
	Business Information Systems	Students must complete 1 junior (6 credit points) + 6 senior units (36 credit points) = 7 units (42 credit points) (No core units are part of this major)										
	Commercial Law	Students must complete 1 junior (6 credit points) + 6 senior units (36 credit points) = 7 units (42 credit points) (No core units are part of this major)										
	Econometrics	Students must complete 1 junior + 6 senior units (42 credit points) outside of the core units (Core unit in this major is: BUSS1020/ECMT1010)										
	Economics*	Students must complete 3 junior units (18 credit points) + 6 senior units (36 credit points) = 9 units (54 credit points) outside of the core units. Core units included in this major are: BUSS1020/ECMT1010.										
	Finance	Students must complete 6 senior units (36 credit points) outside of the core units.										
	IR & HRM	Students must complete 1 junior unit (6 credit points) + 6 senior units (36 credit points) = 7 units (42 credit points) outside of the core units										
	International Business	Students must complete 6 senior units (36 credit points) outside of the core units										
	Management	Students must complete 6 senior units (36 credit points) outside of the core units. If students wish to complete other junior units from WORK or ECOS to allow for more variety of senior electives, then this will restrict the majors with which they combine with the Management major).										
	Quantitative Business Analysis	Students must complete 1 junior unit (6 credit points) + 6 senior units (36 credit points) outside of the core units = 7 units (Core unit in this major is: BUSS1020/ECMT1010)										
Marketing	Students must complete 1 junior unit (6 credit points) + 6 senior units (36 credit points) = 7 units (42 credit points) outside of the core units											

* Due to the requirement of four junior units to complete this major, in many combinations listed above, students would need to exceed by 24/30 credit points in order to complete Economics and another major - falling outside the allowed 18 credit points exceeding requirements for the degree.
