- (iii) A selected list of references for the paper

All authors of the abstracts will be notified by 17 August 2018 at the latest whether their abstracts or papers have been accepted for the conference.

There is also a separate call for papers on the use of interdisciplinary approaches and history as a way to understand contemporary business issues. Papers accepted in response to this call will comprise a special session of the conference with these papers also considered for inclusion (subject to normal refereeing) in a special issue of Accounting History Review. Submissions from scholars in all business disciplines are being encouraged for this session.
