ACADEMIC ENGLISH (AE)

What is Academic English (AE)?

AE prepares you to achieve the IELTS score required to study at a university, TAFE or vocational college in Australia.

It can also prepare you to undertake an internship or to live and work in Australia.

AE also prepares you for admission to our Direct Entry Course (DEC).

What will I learn?

You will learn the English language skills required for participation in university lectures, seminars and tutorials. You will also learn IELTS test-taking skills, including:

- listening for specific information
- understanding what you read
- presenting your ideas in writing
- answering different question types
- speaking confidently under test conditions.

What do I need to enter AE?

You need an IELTS score of 4.0–6.0 or equivalent, or an adequate score on the CET placement test.

What IELTS score can this course help me to achieve?

AE can help you to achieve an IELTS score of up to 6.5–7.0. How long it takes you to achieve this will depend on your current level of English and how quickly you progress in the course.

How many hours a week will I need to study?

You will need to attend classes for 20 hours a week. You will also be expected to do additional work at home.

How long is this course?

You can study AE for 33, 22 or 11 weeks. How long you will need to study will depend on your current level of English, how quickly you progress in the course and the English language entry requirement for your chosen university, TAFE or other course. See the table below for details.

You can also study AE concurrently with other courses.

When does this course start and finish?

There are several intakes per year. The end of each AE course is aligned with the beginning of our Direct Entry Course, so you can progress into DEC through an IELTS or equivalent test. See the table below for details.

How much does it cost to study this course?

Course fee: \$470 per week

Admission fee: \$290

Materials fee: \$75 total for the first five weeks, then \$10 for each additional week.

DIRECT ENTRY COURSE

What is Direct Entry Course (DEC)?

DEC is an English language program that prepares you for direct entry to your chosen course at the University of Sydney.

It covers specific English language and other skills related to your intended area of study, and introduces you to the teaching methods used in the faculty or school that teaches your chosen course.

It also teaches you the general skills necessary for success at university, including participating in tutorials and seminars, writing essays, conducting research and preparing research reports.

DEC can also prepare you for admission to our Advanced Skills for Academic Success program.

What will I learn?

You will learn English with classmates who intend to enter university courses similar to yours. You will also gain experience of the learning environment within the specific faculty or school that teaches your chosen university course.

You will be assessed continuously throughout the course, with tasks based on the assessments set by your chosen faculty or school.

If you successfully achieve all the attendance, assessment and other academic requirements, you will gain direct entry to your chosen university course (subject to visa status).

What do I need to enter DEC?

You need a Conditional Offer of Admission to the University of Sydney and an IELTS result or equivalent.

What IELTS score can this course help me to achieve?

DEC can help you to achieve an IELTS score of up to 6.5–7.5. How long it takes you to achieve this will depend on your current level of English and how quickly you progress in the course.

How many hours a week will I need to study?

You will need to attend classes for 20 hours a week. You will also be expected to do additional work at home.

How long is this course?

You can study DEC for 36, 25, 15 and 10 weeks. How long you will need to study will depend on your current level of English, how quickly you progress in the course and the English language entry requirement for your chosen university course. See the table below for details.

You can also study DEC concurrently with other courses.

When does this course start and finish?

There are several DEC intake dates per year. The end of each DEC course is aligned with the beginning of our Advanced Skills for Academic Success course and with university start dates. See the table below for details.

How much does it cost to study this course?

Course fee: DEC36 \$16,920, DEC25 \$11,750; DEC15 \$7050 and DEC10 \$4700

Admission fee: \$290

INTENSIVE ACADEMIC WRITING INTENSIVE ACADEMIC SPEAKING

What is Intensive Academic Writing (IAW)?

IAW is an intensive course in academic writing that prepares you for study at the University of Sydney.

What will I learn?

You will learn to write essays, reports and assignments for university.

If you successfully achieve all the attendance and assessment requirements of this course, you will satisfy the English language requirements for entry into University of Sydney degree courses.

What do I need to enter this course?

You have met all the university requirements apart from writing.

What IELTS score can this course help me to achieve?

IAW can help you to achieve an IELTS score of up to 6.0–7.0 in writing. How long it takes you to achieve this will depend on your current level of English and how quickly you progress in the course.

How many hours a week will I need to study?

You will need to attend classes for 20 hours a week. You will also be expected to do additional work at home.

How long is this course?

IAW is five weeks long.

When does this course start and finish?

There are two IAW intakes per year. The end of each IAW course is aligned with the beginning of our Advanced Skills for Academic Success course and with university start dates. See the table below for details.

How much does it cost to study this course?

Course Fees: \$2350

Admission Fee: \$290 (non-refundable) payable on acceptance of your offer.

Materials Fee: \$75.

If you successfully achieve all the attendance and assessment requirements of this course, you will satisfy the English language requirements for entry into University of Sydney degree courses.

What do I need to enter this course?

You have met all the university requirements apart from speaking.

What IELTS score can this course help me to achieve?

IAS can help you to achieve an IELTS score of up to 6.5–7.0 in speaking. How long it takes you to achieve this will depend on your current level of English and how quickly you progress in the course.

How long is this course?

IAS is five weeks long.

When does this course start and finish?

There are two IAS intakes per year. The end of each IAS course is aligned with the beginning of our Advanced Skills for Academic Success course and with university start dates. See the table below for details.

How much does it cost to study this course?

Admission Fee: \$290 (non-refundable) payable on acceptance of your offer.

GRADUATE ACADEMIC SKILLS (GAS) ADVANCED SKILLS FOR ACADEMIC SUCCESS (ASAS)

What is Graduate Academic Skills (GAS)?

GAS is a high-level intensive academic English course.

It helps you with a smooth transition to university study in Australia and prepares you for academic success.

What will I learn?

You will learn the academic skills required for success at Australian universities, including writing essays, listening to lectures, participating in tutorials and presenting seminars.

You will also be introduced to critical thinking, research skills and learning strategies.

What do I need to enter this course?

You need a confirmed offer of entry to any undergraduate or postgraduate university course in Australia or New Zealand, or successful completion of any CET University Pathway program.

How many hours a week will I need to study?

You will need to attend classes for 20 hours a week. You will also be expected to do additional work at home.

How long is this course?

GAS is five weeks long.

When does this course start and finish?

There are two GAS intakes per year. The end of each GAS course is aligned with the beginning of our Advanced Skills for Academic Success course and with university start dates. See the table below for details.

How much does it cost to study this course?

Course Fees: \$2350

Admission Fee: \$290 (non-refundable) payable on acceptance of your offer.

Material Fee: \$75.

What is Advanced Skills for Academic success (ASAS)?

ASAS is an intensive academic skills program offered to future world leaders and high potential students intending to study at university in Australia or New Zealand.

What will I learn?

You will attend lectures and tutorials throughout the program, participating in eLearning, excursions, conferences and performances.

Follow up workshops are conducted throughout the first semester of your studies and include practical creativity, critical reading, time management and 1:1 feedback on essay writing.

What do I need to enter this course?

A confirmed undergraduate or postgraduate offer of entry to any university in Australia or New Zealand or successful completion of any CET pathway program.

How many hours a week will I need to study?

You will need to attend classes for 20 hours a week. You will also be expected to do additional work at home.

How long is this course?

ASAS is three weeks long.

When does this course start and finish?

There are two ASAS intakes per year. The end of course dates align with the start of The University of Sydney's Orientation Week activities for Semester 1 and Semester 2 each year.

How much does it cost to study this course?

Course Fees: \$1950

Admission Fee: \$290 (non-refundable) payable on acceptance of your offer.

Materials Fee: \$75.

GENERAL ENGLISH

What is General English (GE)?

GE is designed to improve your English language skills for general conversation, travelling or life in an English-speaking country.

It can also be used to enhance your prospects for employment or for achieving IELTS or other certification.

The GE course is based on the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR), a globally recognised standard for language competencies, and has six levels:

- A1 (Elementary)
- A2 (Pre-intermediate)
- B1 (Intermediate)
- B2 (Upper-intermediate)
- C1 (Advanced)
- C2 (Proficiency).

What will I learn?

You will learn the English language skills necessary to communicate clearly and function successfully in Australia, both socially and professionally.

Classes are interactive and include excursions that offer direct experience of Australian culture and opportunities to practise English in context.

What do I need to enter this course?

There are no entry requirements. You will be placed in a class according to your IELTS score or equivalent or your score on the CET placement test.

What can this course help me to achieve?

GE can help you to achieve the English skills and confidence you need to improve your job prospects, to travel around Australia or to prepare for permanent residency.

It can also help you to improve your IELTS or other test score.

How many hours a week will I need to study?

You will need to attend classes for 20 hours a week. You will also be expected to do additional work at home.

How long is this course?

The minimum course length is two weeks, but the course is usually studied in 11 week blocks. How long you will need to study will depend on your current level of English, how quickly you progress in the course and the English language level you want to achieve.

You can also study GE concurrently with other courses.

When does this course start and finish?

There are nine GE intakes per year, but you can join an ongoing course on any Monday. See the table below for details.

How much does it cost to study this course?

Course Fees: \$425 per week.

Admission Fee: \$290 (non-refundable) payable on acceptance of your offer.

Materials Fee: \$75.00 for the first 5 weeks plus \$10 for every additional week of study.

ENGLISH FOR SPECIFIC PURPOSES (ESP)

WHAT IS ENGLISH FOR SPECIFIC PURPOSES (ESP)?

ESP courses offer you an opportunity to explore the English language skills and concepts relevant to your areas of study, work or interest.

WHAT WILL I LEARN?

You will learn and practise the English language skills required to succeed in your chosen field.

INTENSIVE TEST PREPARATION PROGRAM (ITP)

What are Intensive Test Preparation (ITP) programs?

ITP programs are intensive preparation courses for students intending to undertake English language testing through IELTS, TOEFL or the Pearson Test of English (PTE).
