- Because it is easier to make, use, store and share digital media than tapes.
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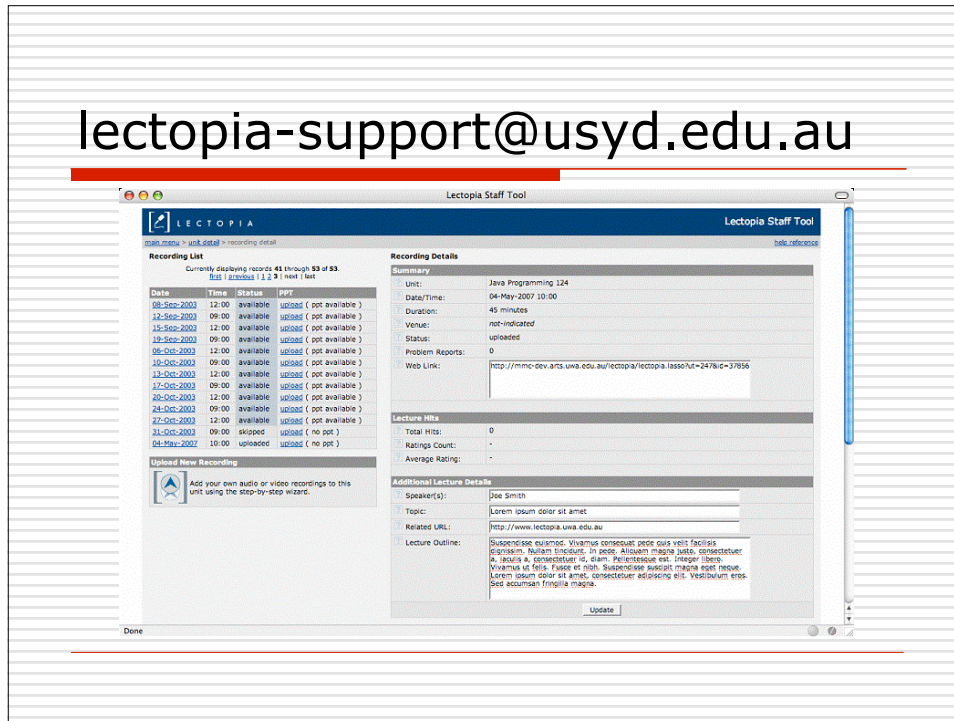
Using digital recordings

Sharing

- Digital files can be very large and difficult to share
 - Use file sharing/storing sites
 - Eg DropSend
 - <http://www.dropsend.com/>
 - Convert to MP3 or text
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Converting to MP3

- Using itunes to convert an a wav file into an MP3 file
 - Under the **Source** menu on your iTunes window, select **Library**.
 - Drag the audio file into the song list window. It will be copied there. Click on the filename once to highlight it.
 - From the **Advanced** menu, choose **Convert**.
 - By default, the MP3s are saved in the **Macintosh HD>Users>Current User indicated by the 'house' icon >Music> iTunes>iTunes Music** folder.
