## **QUALIFICATIONS**

**Entry to the Graduate Certificate of Indigenous Languages Education requires that candidates have successfully completed two years towards a teaching qualification, that is; a Diploma in Education (Aboriginal), or equivalent. In some cases it may be possible for candidates with similar but different qualifications to be granted admission.**

**Entry to the Graduate Diploma of Indigenous Languages Education requires that candidates have successfully completed the Graduate Certificate of Indigenous Languages Education.**

**Entry to the Master of Indigenous Languages Education requires that candidates have completed either:**

- a **four year teaching qualification**, that is; a Bachelor of Education, or a three year degree and a Diploma of Education, or;
- the **Graduate Certificate of Indigenous Languages Education** with an average mark of 70% or higher.

**In some cases it may be possible for candidates with similar but different qualifications to be granted admission.**

## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION**

NSW DET acknowledges the availability of the *Master of Indigenous Languages Education* offered at the University of Sydney and accepts this program as providing appropriate training for qualified Aboriginal teachers seeking additional approval to teach an Aboriginal language. Aboriginal teachers completing the *Master of Indigenous Languages Education* up to the end of 2010 will be eligible for approval to teach Aboriginal languages. In 2009 the Department will reconsider the *Master of Indigenous Languages Education* and any other available Aboriginal languages programs in terms of the requirements for Aboriginal languages teachers after 2010.

The Graduate Certificate of Indigenous Languages Education is completed in one semester full-time and consists of four units of study:

KCIL5610 Sounds & Writing in Indigenous Languages  
KCIL5611 Words & Meanings in Indigenous Languages  
KCIL5612 Sentences & Text in Indigenous Languages  
KCIL5613 Theories & Methods in Language Learning

Students who complete the requirements for the Graduate Certificate may extend their study and qualify for the Graduate Diploma of Indigenous Languages Education by undertaking a further two units of study in the second semester chosen from the following:

KCIL5622 Learning an Indigenous Language  
KCIL5623 Language Curriculum Development  
KCIL5624 Technology & Language Learning

*Graduate Diploma candidates are part-time in the second semester and are therefore not eligible for study allowance during that semester.*

Students who qualify for the Graduate Certificate with an average mark of 70% or above may apply for entry to the Master of Indigenous Languages Education in the second semester.

To qualify for the award of the Master of Indigenous Languages Education students must complete four units of study chosen from the following, in addition to completing all four offered in the first semester:

KCIL5620 Research Methods in Languages Education  
KCIL5621 Research Project in Languages Education (elective)  
KCIL5622 Learning an Indigenous Language (elective)  
KCIL5623 Language Curriculum Development  
KCIL5624 Technology & Language Learning

The Master of Indigenous Languages Education program includes two elective units of study in the second semester: *KCIL5622 Learning an Indigenous Language*, and; *KCIL5621 Research Project in Languages Education*. Students may undertake one of these units, but not both. To enrol in *KCIL5622 Learning an Indigenous Language* students must be able to locate an appropriate external course in a language of interest to them that involves 36 hours of language learning.

Students who can already speak an Indigenous Australian language fairly well should undertake *KCIL5621 Research Project in Indigenous Languages* unless there is an external course available for them to further develop their fluency, or they wish to undertake an external course in a different language.

Students who cannot already speak an Indigenous Australian language can undertake either of the electives. However, if they are unable to locate an appropriate external course in a language of interest to them, they may be able to use *KCIL5621 Research Project in Indigenous Languages* to undertake a project that will help them develop fluency in that language.

The University of Sydney offers a six credit point unit of study in Gamilaraay in the mainstream Bachelor of Arts. To undertake this unit of study students must be able to attend classes in Sydney one day each week for 13 weeks in the first semester. However, because it is not offered as a block course no travel, accommodation or meal allowances are available.
