## UNDERSTANDING HOW TO PARTICIPATE IN ENVIRONMENTAL MARKETS IN AUSTRALIA

Governments at the Federal and State levels have been committed to establishing markets in environmental products for at least a decade.

Markets are already operating in various types of carbon credits and water access licences, while a market in biodiversity credits is emerging in New South Wales.

A national emissions trading scheme will be operative by 2011.

This seminar will assess the current state of these markets but will address the practical issue of how to actually trade in these products, and document those trades.
