Gareth Evans is President Emeritus of the International Crisis Group and a former Australian Foreign Minister (1988-1996). He played a major role in developing the UN peace plan for Cambodia and co-chaired the International Commission on Intervention and State Sovereignty which proposed the responsibility to protect (R2P) as an international law obligation of states towards all populations at risk of genocide and other mass atrocity crimes.

The Law, Governance and Social Justice series promotes discussion about ways in which laws, legal processes and other aspects of governance can affect social justice in Australia and overseas.
