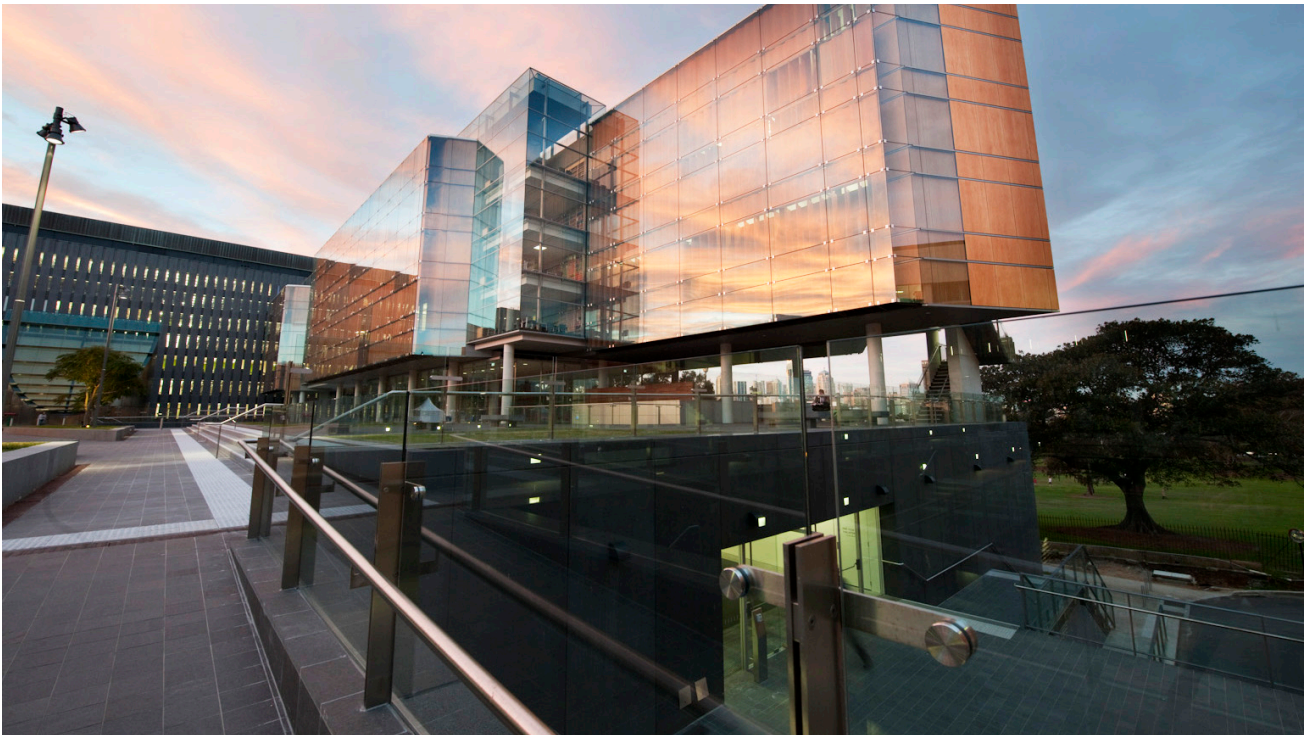

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

For coursework degrees, you are required to have a relevant undergraduate degree at an appropriate level.

FEES

Fees for local or domestic students are \$3,540 per six credit point unit of study in 2012. The estimated cost for a Graduate Diploma is \$14,160. The estimated cost for a Masters is \$28,320. You can pay up-front or defer your tuition fee payment through the Commonwealth Government's FEE-HELP scheme – www.goingtouni.gov.au Fees for international students are A\$4,350 per unit for coursework degrees which is approximately \$A17,400 for a Graduate Diploma and \$A34,800 for a Masters.
