This two hour workshop introduces participants to reading and interpreting clinical trials. The workshop will help participants distinguish between low and high quality research, and identify the key ways of minimising bias in clinical trials and systematic reviews.

Who is the workshop intended for ?

Allied health clinicians:

- ~ who read journal articles but have little experience with critical appraisal
- ~ without post-graduate training in research design
- ~ who have a broad understanding of randomised controlled trials
- ~ who need to critically evaluate healthcare literature for clinical practice
