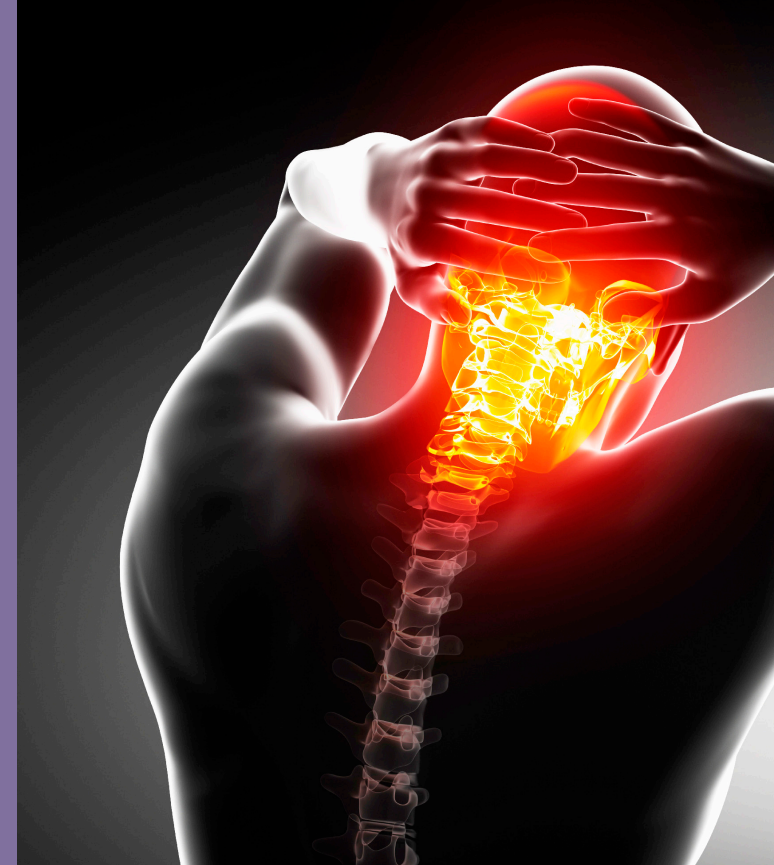
ABOUT THE INSTITUTE

The Pain Management Research Institute consists of a multidisciplinary group of health professionals and research staff who are collaborating to improve pain treatment, education, and research in adults and children. The staff includes:

WORKSHOP OUTLINE

This intensive workshop program provides a comprehensive overview of all major aspects of pain management, integrating basic science with its clinical application. The content is based on the IASP endorsed Master of Medicine/ Science in Medicine (Pain Management) program, University of Sydney. Workshop's 1 and 2 are designed as a package and attendance at both is ideal but not essential.

WORKSHOP 1: THE PROBLEM OF PAIN

The first week introduces participants to the extent of the problem and explores pain contributors and assessment. Topic areas include:

- Concepts and assessment of pain
- Epidemiology and evidence-based medicine
- Psychological contributors of pain
- Acute pain
- Headache and orofacial pain
- Neurobiology related to mechanisms of pain
- Neuroimmune aspects of pain
- Pharmacology of pain
- Pain and sleep
- Cancer pain and cancer survivorship

WORKSHOP 2: THE MANAGEMENT OF PAIN

In the second week participants explore current principles of pain management. Topic areas include:

- Interdisciplinary management of chronic pain
- Musculoskeletal pain management and rehabilitation
- Pain management in children and older people
- Placebo analgesia
- Interventional pain management
- Mood, personality disorders and suicide
- Neuropathic and visceral pain management
- Pain and addiction
- Ethical issues
- Complementary therapies
