WORKSHOP OUTLINE

This intensive workshop program provides a comprehensive overview of all major aspects of pain management, integrating basic science with its clinical application. The content is based on the IASP endorsed Master of Medicine/Science in Medicine (Pain Management) degree program, The University of Sydney. Workshop's 1 and 2 are designed as a package and attendance at both is ideal but not essential.
