William Inglis Scholarship Application Form

Introductory Information

William Inglis gained his medical qualifications from the University of Sydney in 1943. He attended the Faculty of Medicine's 150th anniversary dinner and spoke to the Dean about his intention to set up a scholarship to support Indigenous students in the health area. Dr Inglis passed away before he was able to act on his intention, his daughter and son-in-law, Pamela and Paul Wood, have carried through with his idea and set up the William Inglis Indigenous Support fund which supports amongst other things the William Inglis Scholarship and a bookfund for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander health students in the Faculty of Medicine in his memory through the USA Foundation.

Up to 5 scholarships will be given each year for about 5 years. Pamela and Paul Wood have also generously allocated some of these funds for the purchase of text books so that all students enrolled in the Graduate Diploma in Indigenous Health Promotion or the Graduate Diploma in Indigenous Health (Substance Use) will receive one free text book.

Scholarship Information

The scholarship is valued at \$1,500 per semester (tenable for 2 semesters only) for students enrolled in a graduate diploma with an additional \$1,000 for those who continue on to the Master of Indigenous Health (Substance Use). The scholarship will be used firstly to pay the up-front HECS contribution towards tuition costs of scholarship recipients. The rest will be dispersed to scholarship recipients for additional course costs or living expenses.

Eligibility

- Students enrolled in the Graduate Diploma in Indigenous Health Promotion or Graduate Diploma in Indigenous Health (Substance Use) or Master of Indigenous Health (Substance Use)
- Demonstration of financial need
- A demonstrated commitment to Indigenous health and welfare.

The scholarships will be given to the students who best fit these criteria.

Conditions for Scholarship Recipients

Students who receive scholarships must maintain satisfactory progress in their first semester to have the scholarship paid in the second semester. Those students who do not progress satisfactorily will not receive the scholarship in second semester. In this case, the next person on the ranking list will receive a scholarship for semester 2 only.

Students who receive a scholarship and progress on to the Master of Indigenous Health (Substance Use) without a break, will receive \$1,000 in the second year.
