His thesis for the degree of Doctor of Philosophy was submitted to the University of Toronto shortly before his death in 1953. Awarded annually on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Physiology to a student who is enrolled for Physiology Honours in the Faculty of Science who requires financial assistance in order to attend a conference, seminar or other meeting within Australia and who has, to the satisfaction of the Head, demonstrated academic merit. More than one award may be made each year.

1.  The scholarship shall be awarded on merit to a woman who is a citizen or permanent resident of Australia enrolling into an honours program in the Faculty of Science at the University of Sydney.
2.  The Scholarship may not be held with other scholarships which, combined, have a value which exceeds \$4,999 p.a.
3.  The scholarship is offered for, and is tenable in, a specific honours program, and is not transferable to another program, except with the permission of the Dean of Science.
4.  A confirmed offer of the scholarship must be taken up at the time of enrolment in the nominated honours program, and no deferment of the scholarship is allowed.
5.  The scholarship is for one year only and is valued at \$800. The recipient will be required to refund all or part of the scholarship received if she subsequently withdraws from the nominated honours program. If awarded to a part-time student the scholarship will be paid in two equal instalments over 4 semesters and is subject to the recipients continuing enrolment in the nominated honours program.
6.  The scholarship shall be awarded annually in April so long as funds permit.

Dr Heydon's research work in Parasitology produced important contributions, notably on malaria, and he held the positions of Parasitologist to the School of Public Health and Tropical Medicine and Lecturer in Parasitology in the University between 1930 and 1946. His many generous donations included \$70 000 to the University for the establishment of the Charles Gilbert Heydon Travelling Fellowship in Biological Sciences, as a memorial to his father. Awarded annually by the Dean of the Faculty of Science, on the recommendation of the Academic-in-Charge of the History and Philosophy of Science Unit to the student in the Faculty of Science who shows the greatest proficiency in both HPSC2101 (or HPSC2901) What Is This Thing Called Science? and HPSC2100 (or HPSC2900) The Birth of Modern Science, provided the students work is of sufficient merit.

P0086	<b>Postgraduate Excellence Prize in Biological Sciences</b>	1

Established by the School of Biological Sciences in 2002. The prize may be awarded for 2003 and annually thereafter, subject to the availability of funds. Applications will be accepted from postgraduate students who are enrolled at the University of Sydney in the School of Biological Sciences as higher research degree candidates. Applicants will be selected for the prize on the basis of their research performance, provided that they can demonstrate that they can complete a PhD degree within 3-5 years (or part time equivalent) from initial enrolment. The objects of the prize are: to encourage the development of skills that will make Sydney University postgraduates more competitive in the job market; to encourage postgraduates to define clearly the research aims for their PhD and their progress towards meeting those aims; and to encourage completion of PhD requirements within 3-5 years. Applicants shall be required to provide a summary of the aims of their research project, their results to date, and to give a seminar. The prizewinner shall be nominated by the Head of School on the recommendation of the School's Postgraduate Studies Committee and a panel of three members of the academic staff of the School appointed by the Committee, who shall have regard for the following criteria: the applicant's ability to communicate the aims of his/her research and its importance; the amount of new insight the applicant's research contributes to knowledge in the area; and the likelihood of the applicant's achieving his/her aims and submitting a thesis within 3-5 years as a PhD candidate. In the event of a tie, the number of external awards, grants, prizes, or scholarships awarded for the purpose of the candidate's postgraduate research shall also be considered. The prize may be used to supplement an existing award, for conference attendance, as a stipend to be used as a contribution toward living expenses, or for research expenses. Where insufficient funds are available, the prize may take the form of a book, medallion or certificate. The prize may be shared. It will only be awarded where there is a candidate of sufficient merit. The value of the prize is to be determined by the Head of School on an annual basis.

P0095	<b>Mary Besly Memorial Prize for Best Assignment in the Area of Invertebrate Zoology</b>	1

Established in 1995 from donations by friends and colleagues of Mary Besly who was associated with the University from 1952 - 1989. The Mary Besly Memorial Prize shall be awarded to the Intermediate or Senior student who submits the best assignment (eg. essay or poster) in the area of invertebrate zoology. Submissions will be judged on the criteria of accuracy, originality and communication. Assignments may be submitted by individual students or recommended by members of the academic staff. The prize is awarded annually, provided there is a candidate of sufficient merit, by a panel consisting of the Head of the School of Biological Sciences, the Executive Officer of the most relevant Intermediate or Senior unit of study, a member of staff from the Australian Museum (nominated by the Head of the School of Biological Sciences) and on other member of staff of the School of Biological Sciences (also nominated by the Head of the School). The prize shall take the form of scholarly text(s) nominated by the student. If two or more candidates are of equal merit the prize may be shared.

Results from both Intermediate and Senior years are taken into account and if more than one student is eligible the prize may be shared. In the event of the prize not being awarded in any one year, an additional prize may be awarded the next year or the value of the prize may be increased.

Prof. Cockayne established the Australian Key Centre for Microscopy and Microanalysis, which enabled the expansion of the research capabilities of the unit. he ran an active research laboratory, studying the interface between crystals of materials that were of significance to the semiconductor industry. Prof Cockayne also established the postgraduate degree courses in microscopy and microanalysis. He was the first president of the Australian Society Electron Microscopy and promoted microscopy vigorously in Australia and abroad. He took up the chair in materials science at Oxford University in 2000, and he was awarded the Massey Medal of the Institute of Physics in 2008.
