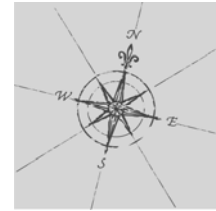


GEOVET 2010

On behalf of the steering committee, it is my pleasure to welcome you to GEOVET 2010.

GEOVET 2010 will be the premier scientific event this year for those with an interest in spatial disease patterns, risk factors and control method.

GEOVET 2010 will provide an international forum for researchers, policy-makers and agencies that use spatial epidemiological methods to present, review and discuss methods and applications. The scope of GEOVET 2010 includes data management systems, surveillance, statistical and modelling approaches, the application of geographic information systems, and remote sensing applications in veterinary science, veterinary public health and zoonotic disease research and control activities. The scope includes domestic animal, wildlife and human populations.

This conference mirrors the successful GEOMED conferences, and continues in the tradition of the previous GISVET conferences.

The venue for the conference is The Faculty of Veterinary Science, The University of Sydney. This year our Faculty is celebrating 100 years of continuous veterinary education. The campus is stunning, with exquisite gothic architecture. We are located less than 3 km from the centre of Sydney. December in Sydney is a beautiful time of the year, with average daily temperatures ranging from 17 to 25°C and low rainfall.
