THE KASHMIR PREHISTORY PROJECT

A film by Professor Alison Betts, The University of Sydney



When Alison Betts, James Fraser and Michael Spate went to Kashmir in June 2015 to open up a new area of archaeological research for the University of Sydney, they captured their adventures in this stunningly beautiful Himalayan Valley on film. The film shows the business of archaeology in action, with its excitement, adventure, anxiety and joy. Archaeology is not just about the trenches, but also the journey and about the people you meet along the way.

Professor Alison Betts is Professor of Silk Road Studies at the University of Sydney and the Director of the University of Sydney Central Asian Programme.

Professor Betts's research interests include the Epipalaeolithic to Bronze Age Levant on the arable/steppe margins, the pre- and proto-history of Central Asia, the background to Zoroastrianism, nomadic peoples, nomad/state relations, early pastoral communities, game drives, lithic studies, graffiti and rock art, and the prehistory of herbal medicine.
