

Masterclass: Leadership in Aboriginal Contexts

A masterclass for experienced teachers and school leaders K-12 Friday 15 November 2019, 9.00am-3.00pm | The University of Sydney



Purposeful and ethical leadership is fundamental to establishing and maintaining a culture of learning and education success. In schools, strong and proactive leadership facilitates high expectations, high academic achievement and engagement with colleagues, students, parents and communities. However, many teachers and educators lack the knowledge, skills and confidence in leading culturally responsive sustainable change in their schools or education system that makes a difference to Aboriginal student outcomes. This has significant social justice and human rights implications as the gap between Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal student outcomes persist.

This masterclass aims to develop your culturally responsive leadership skills in Aboriginal education contexts that will contribute to improving the educational outcomes of Aboriginal students.

It will provide you with opportunities to critically analyse policies and practices within the broader context of education in order to consider the implications of these for your school. Responsive innovative approaches to the challenges of preparing educational leaders committed to social justice and equity for Aboriginal peoples will be discussed.

Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal models, styles and purposes of leadership will be explored including theoretical frameworks such as social justice, ethical, instructional, distributive and transformational leadership.
