

### **Terms and Conditions**

## 1. Background

a. This Prize was established in 2023 with the aim of providing support to students pursuing coursework within the Faculty of Medicine and Health at the University of Sydney.

- b. Applicants who have already received a scholarship or prize of equal or greater value which is awarded on the basis of academic merit in the same year at the time of awarding will not be eligible for this prize.



#### 3. Selection Criteria

- a. The Prize will be awarded on the basis of academic merit. Academic merit will be determined by the student with the highest weighted average mark (WAM) in the final semester of their course. For courses in which the units of study are grade-only, students will be awarded based on performance criteria determined by the School.
- b. The Prize will be awarded by the Executive Dean and Pro Vice-Chancellor, Medicine, and Health.

### 4. Value

- c. This Prize has a value of \$5,000 and will be paid as a one-off payment.
- d. The Prize will be awarded subject to the availability of funds.
- e. No other amount is payable.

#### 5. Termination

- a. The University reserves the right to withdraw the Prize, if the University determines that the student is guilty of serious misconduct, including, but not limited to, having provided false or misleading information that has a relationship to the awarding of this Prize.
- b. Once withdrawn the Prize will not be reinstated unless due to University error.
