



## **Zarax Prize**

### **Terms and Conditions**

#### **1. Background**

- a. The Zarax Prize is awarded for the best essay in senior units of study in Modern Greek and Byzantine Studies.
- b. This Prize is funded by a donation from the Modern Greek Studies Foundation

#### **2. Eligibility Criteria**

- a. To be considered eligible for this Prize, students must be studying Modern Greek and Byzantine Studies in the School of Languages and Cultures within the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences.
- a. Eligible students must be enrolled in any of the following units\*:
  - i. MGRK3001 Greek Modernism in European Context or,
  - ii. MGRK3603 Modern Greek Politics or,
  - iii. MGRK3604 Contemporary Art in Greece or,
  - iv. MGRK3605 Greek Modernity and its Others or,
  - v. MGRK3633 Greekness and Hellenism or,
  - vi. MGRK3693 Cinema in Greece.

\* (only two units are offered per year on a rotational basis)

#### **3. Selection Criteria**

- b. The Prize will be awarded annually to a student based on prior academic merit who produces the best essay in senior units of study in Modern Greek and Byzantine Studies.
- c. The Prize will be awarded by the Head of the School of Languages and Cultures.

#### **4. Value**

- a. This Prize has a value of \$1000.00 and will be paid as a one-off payment.
- b. No other amount is payable.
- c. The Prize will be awarded subject to the availability of funds.

#### **5. Ongoing Eligibility**

- a. None apply.
