Completing the Unit of Study Enrolment Form

The Study Abroad and Student Exchange Programs offer a large range of units of study across most academic disciplines in the University of Sydney.

- A unit of study is the class (subject) in which you enrol, normally worth 6 credit points each.
- You will generally only enrol in 4 units each semester for a total of 24 credit points, which is equivalent to 30 ECTS credits in Europe or 16 credit hours in North America.
- The minimum study load for Australian immigration purposes is 18 credit points. If you do not supply at least 18 credit points and list no alternatives, you will **not** be given a Firm Offer of Admission to the University.
- You should select a total of at least 8 preferred and alternative units of study when you apply. A total of 24 credit points
- Postgraduate units are NOT available to students who are currently enrolled in an undergraduate program.
- You will need to consider whether you have met the pre-requisites for each unit before completing the enrolment form (on Page 1).
- We recommend you consult with the Academic Adviser at your home institution before selecting units.
- Some areas of study have additional entry requirements (see Page 3)

Level	This level is usually available to students who:
Junior (1000)	...are in any year of study (equivalent to USA Freshman or Sophomore level)
Intermediate (2000)	...have completed at least 1 full year of study in that area (equivalent to USA Junior level)
Senior (3000)	...have completed at least 2-3 full years of study in that area (equivalent to USA Senior level)
Honours (4000)	...have completed at least 3 full years of study in that area
Postgraduate (5000+)	...have completed an undergraduate degree in that area.

FINDING UNITS OF STUDY

Step 1: Go to the University of Sydney's **Study Abroad and Exchange Unit of Study website:**
http://sydney.edu.au/future_students/study_abroad/study/choice/index.shtml.

Step 2: Under "How to find units of study", select the link "[Find a course](#)". Type the name of the unit of study or discipline you are interested in, for example "*Indigenous Australia*" and select the drop down option "*Units of Study*". A list will appear with units of study most relevant to your search. Click on the unit code link eg: "KOCR2600 Indigenous Australia: An Introduction" for more information.

Step 3: *Optional* - If you require additional information about any of the units of study that are listed then we advise you to contact the relevant faculty or department (http://sydney.edu.au/about/faculties_schools.shtml). Some course outlines are also available from the **Course and Unit of Study Portal (CUSP)** (<http://cusp.sydney.edu.au/students/view-units-page/>)

NOTE: While every effort will be made to enrol you in your selected units, we cannot guarantee the availability of all units of study. Your final enrolment is dependent on successful timetabling of your units. Unit of study timetables are normally available one week prior to semester which ensures that the students who are enrolled in the units of study can be placed either in additional lecture times or in larger venues, if higher student numbers are enrolled than expected. This is necessary since most units do not have quotas. Should you experience any difficulties, the International Office will assist you with changes to your enrolment during the first two weeks of classes.

Students will gain a critical awareness of traditional and contemporary Indigenous Australia, and develop a decolonised critical framework which underpins the IAS major.

The areas of study listed below have special admission requirements. If you select units of study from these areas it may delay the outcome of your application, therefore, only choose units from these areas if absolutely necessary. To gain approval for these units you may be required to:

- Submit additional materials eg: audition tapes, portfolio, detailed class outlines etc.
- Fulfill specific academic requirements.
- Start classes earlier than the normal semester due to fieldwork or other special components.

Most faculties are located on the Camperdown/Darlington Campus, near the edge of the city of Sydney.

Travel distances to units of study located on other campuses is indicated below – Health Science, Music and Visual Arts

Postgraduate Units of Study (exc. Arts)

Students who plan to study any postgraduate unit(s) excluding Arts and Social Sciences normally require approval prior to enrolment. Undergraduate students are not eligible for postgraduate units under any circumstance. Generally, postgraduate units have a code of 5000 or higher; for example, MKTG5001 - Marketing Principles.

Arts and Social Sciences

Media & Communications

Units are only open to students majoring in a Media and Communications program at their home university. Approval is required. Production units are not guaranteed. Quotas apply.

Agriculture and Environment

Agriculture units require pre-approval. Some units of study include field excursions. Contact the Study Abroad and Exchange Unit for further information.

Architecture, Design & Planning

Students must have completed 3 years of Architecture to enrol in Architecture units (excluding Art Workshop – see below). Students are not permitted to take core units in the Bachelor of Design but may choose electives as outlined at <http://sydney.edu.au/handbooks/architecture/#table a>. Students must submit a portfolio of their work in PDF format between 8-12 pages and no larger than 5MB. Students who require a studio placement are encouraged to begin their studies in March Semester. Many Architecture units of study have quota restrictions so students should complete and return this form early.

Art Workshops / Art Studio

Limited places may be available for introductory art units that do not require previous experience (AWSS - 6 credits or DESA - 4 credits). Students cannot pre-enrol into these units, but will be enrolled during Orientation week if approved. However, you must include any Art Studio units you plan to take on this form. See also **Visual Arts electives below under 'Visual Arts (Sydney College of the Arts)** for more art options. Art studio units of study require an extra fee.

Business School

All units of study from 2nd year (2000 level) upwards require pre-approval, including postgraduate units. Students seeking 2000 level units and higher are required to submit descriptions of previous courses completed, and any current courses being taking this semester in order for the Faculty to assess pre-requisites. Without at least foundational background in the areas of study chosen, you will not be approved. Read the pre-requisites carefully to ensure you have completed equivalent courses at your home institution before choosing a 2000 level unit of study or higher.

Education and Social Work

Education

Only undergraduate practicum units of study and postgraduate units of study within Education require pre-approval. Education students may be subject to a police security check before being enrolled into Education practicum. Some 4000 level Education units are open to undergraduate students, eg EDUH4052, EDUH4053, EDUH4058. Students may enroll in EDGU2000 Teaching English Internationally 1 without pre-approval.

Education and Social Work (continued)

Department of Social Work

Students who plan to study any Social Work unit(s) are required to submit descriptions of previous courses completed. As a condition of gaining access to NSW Health Department facilities, students must comply with NSW Health Department policy for all health care workers who undertake training or field work in the NSW health care system. This means students are subject to:

- a criminal record check
- a documented screening & vaccination history,
- a Prohibited Persons Declaration

Engineering

Students must be enrolled in a relevant engineering degree to gain approval for advanced units. All units of study from 2nd year (2000 level) onwards require pre-approval, including postgraduate units of study.

Health Sciences (Separate Campus)

Students who plan to study any Health Science unit(s) are required to submit descriptions of previous courses completed. All Health Science units of study require pre-approval. Note that the Faculty of Health Sciences, Cumberland Campus, is located approximately 1 hour from the main Camperdown/Darlington campus by public transport. Please be aware that the NSW Health Department policy and requirements stated under the **Department of Social Work** applies to students in the Faculty of Health Science who might be undertaking fieldwork in the NSW health care system.

Law

All Law units require pre-approval. Students must be currently enrolled in a qualifying law course to obtain approval for all law units except **LAWS1006 – Foundations of Law**. JD students (and Masters students who have already completed the requirements of an LLB or equivalent) will enrol in JD units only (5000 level). Only faculty-specific exchange students AND Study Abroad students, who have completed a minimum of 2 years of law, may enrol in up to two Masters units (6000 level) listed at http://sydney.edu.au/law/cstudent/coursework/course_info.shtml. Enrolment is conditional on the student undertaking a minimum of two LLB or JD units in conjunction with the Masters units. An additional faculty-based approval process is required which students undertake when they arrive in Sydney.

Medicine

The Graduate Sydney Medical Program (MBBS) is closed. Limited postgraduate medicine units may be available and faculty approval is required. Some undergraduate units of study are also available and do not need approval, however, only Science majors should consider these units. The Faculty holds a bridging program for new students each semester.

Pharmacy

Students who plan to study any Pharmacy unit(s) require pre-approval.

Music (Separate Campus)

Only music majors may apply to study at the Conservatorium. Submit applications by the deadline. **Late applications will not be accepted.** All units of study require approval. Performance units may be available with faculty. Audition requirements for Principal Study can be found at: <http://music.sydney.edu.au/study/audition-requirements/>. Auditions should be on DVD (region free) or VCD. A statement attesting that it is a true recording must accompany the DVD/VCD and be signed both by the teacher and student. The Conservatorium of Music is located 20 minutes from the main Camperdown /Darlington campus by public transport.

Science

Field Trips

Teaching for units of study that include a field trip or laboratory component may begin before the official start of semester. Contact the Study Abroad and Exchange Unit about start dates. Field trip attendance is mandatory in order to successfully complete the unit. Units that may include field trips have unit of study codes that begin with BIOL, ENVI, GEOG or GEOS.

School of Physics

All PHYS units of study require approval.

School of Psychology

Psychology is only available at the undergraduate level (1000-3000). Strictly no coaching units available. The School of Psychology has produced entry guidelines for incoming Study Abroad and Exchange students to help you choose units that are appropriate for your educational background. http://sydney.edu.au/science/psychology/future_students/doc/incoming_exchange_students2010Jan.pdf

Veterinary Science

Very limited access may be given to qualified students for ANSC, VBS or VETS units at the 2000 and 300 levels. Units are closed at 1000, 4000 and 5000 levels. Students who plan on studying any Veterinary Science unit(s) are required to submit descriptions of previous courses completed. All units of study require approval prior to enrolment.

Visual Arts (Separate Campus)

Visual Art majors choosing units at the Sydney College of the Arts (SCA) must to submit a portfolio of their work. Portfolios must include 10 examples of work and be presented in slide, VHF video, photograph or CD ROM (state size). Portfolio assessment is based on the following criteria:

- evident potential for development of skills
- evidence of hand-eye skills
- articulation of a sustained idea or concept
- demonstration of a high level of lateral or creative thinking

Many SCA units have quota restrictions so submit applications early. *Some electives are available to non-Visual Arts majors.* Note that the Sydney College of the Arts is approximately 45 minutes from the Camperdown /Darlington campus by public transport.
