Below are eight steps to help you to apply for undergraduate study at the University of Sydney.

1	<input type="checkbox"/> Find a Course	Research the courses available at the University of Sydney by visiting: sydney.edu.au/courses . You may also like to visit us for a campus tour, or attend major events such as Open Day: sydney.edu.au/open_day
2	<input type="checkbox"/> Check entry requirements	Find out about undergraduate entry requirements - sydney.edu.au/ug-entry Make note of the entry requirements relating to your course, including our fixed ATARs (or equivalent scores) to guarantee admission to most courses - sydney.edu.au/sydney-atar Some courses have specific selection criteria, assumed knowledge and/or prerequisites. Note: From 2019, some courses will have a mathematics prerequisite for students completing a senior secondary (year 12) qualification in Australia. 3	<input type="checkbox"/> Find out 'How to Apply'	As a New Zealand citizen you are eligible for a Commonwealth supported place (CSP), subsidised by the Australian Government. All domestic students apply through the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC)* at uac.edu.au , whether you are completing the New Zealand National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) Level 3, International Baccalaureate (IB), or GCE Cambridge A Levels. For students completing the NCEA, an Interstate Transfer Index (ITI) will be calculated by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) and provided to UAC. You can do so via the University's Find a Course website. sydney.edu.au/courses , search for your course, then click on the 'Apply' button on the course page.
4	<input type="checkbox"/> See which scholarships are available	We award many scholarships each year. Check the Scholarships website for more information: sydney.edu.au/scholarships
5	<input type="checkbox"/> Check out accommodation options	Explore the accommodation options by visiting our student accommodation website: sydney.edu.au/accommodation
6	<input type="checkbox"/> Apply through UAC	Make sure you are aware of important dates and deadlines: uac.edu.au/undergraduate/key-dates.shtml . Once you have chosen the degree, submit your application via UAC. You can find out the UAC code for the degree of your choice on the UAC website or the UAC Guide: uac.edu.au/undergraduate/course-search
7	<input type="checkbox"/> Accept your offer	Once you receive an offer from the University of Sydney via UAC, you will be sent more information on how to accept or defer your place. You will also receive additional information on orientation, enrolment and important dates. sydney.edu.au/start
8	<input type="checkbox"/> Pay your fees	As a New Zealand Citizen you will be eligible for CSP. The fees are dependent on the subjects you undertake, not the university you attend or course you are studying. You will most likely need to pay your student contribution amount upfront, however, some New Zealand citizens are eligible for HECS Help. For more information, visit: sydney.edu.au/ug-fees and click 'Fees and Loans' and then 'Commonwealth Supported Places'.
