Below are the steps to help onshore international students apply for undergraduate study at the University of Sydney.

1	<input type="checkbox"/> Find a course	Research the courses available at the University of Sydney by visiting: sydney.edu.au/courses You may also like to visit us for a campus tour, or attend major events such as Open Day: sydney.edu.au/open_day
2	<input type="checkbox"/> Check entry requirements	Find out about undergraduate entry requirements - sydney.edu.au/ug-entry Make note of the entry requirements relating to your course, including our fixed ATARs (or equivalent scores) to guarantee admission to most courses - sydney.edu.au/sydney-atar Some courses have specific additional selection criteria, assumed knowledge and/or prerequisites. Note: From 2019, some courses will have a mathematics prerequisite for students completing a senior secondary (year 12) qualification in Australia. 3	<input type="checkbox"/> Find out 'How to Apply'	There are two ways to apply to the University of Sydney, depending on your qualifications: <ul style="list-style-type: none">- If you are an international student onshore completing an Australian Year 12 or IB diploma, you should apply through the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC)*. Follow the prompts through: uac.edu.au/international- All other international students onshore apply directly to the University via the University's Find a Course website. sydney.edu.au/courses, search for your course, then click on the 'Apply' button on the course page. <p>*If you are applying for a Sciences Po dual degree you must apply directly to the University even if you are applying through UAC for other courses.</p>
4	<input type="checkbox"/> See what scholarships are available	There are various scholarships on offer. Visit the scholarships website for more information: sydney.edu.au/scholarships/prospective/international_students.shtml
5	<input type="checkbox"/> Check out the accommodation options	Explore the accommodation options by visiting our student accommodation website: sydney.edu.au/accommodation
6	<input type="checkbox"/> Apply and receive an offer	Check important application dates and deadlines and apply well in time for your preferred course. <ul style="list-style-type: none">- UAC - uac.edu.au/international/key-dates.shtml- Direct - check the course on sydney.edu.au/courses Depending on your application method, you may get an offer from the University directly or via UAC. If you receive a conditional offer , you may need to satisfy certain criteria such as academic and English language conditions before you can be issued with an unconditional offer. If you receive an unconditional offer , your next step is to accept your offer.
7	<input type="checkbox"/> Accept your offer and pay your fees	To accept your unconditional offer log onto the Sydney Student Portal - sydneystudent.sydney.edu.au/sitsvision/wrd/siw_lgn . UAC applicants will also receive a confirmation email from us with instructions on how to accept your offer online. Once you confirm your place at the University of Sydney, you must pay your fees, which includes the semester tuition fee and overseas students health cover (OSHC). You will then receive an electronic Confirmation of Enrolment (eCoE), which can be used to apply for your student visa. For more information visit: sydney.edu.au/ug-int-accept .
