## Receive your result

### Check our fixed ATAR requirement

Most of our courses have fixed ATARs or IBs for 2018, which means you can guarantee your place. This doesn't apply to some courses and others have extra requirements. ## Your pathways

### Apply for a similar course with a lower ATAR

You are welcome to apply for a course transfer after your first year of studies. Check out the our ATARs to get an idea of entry requirements:

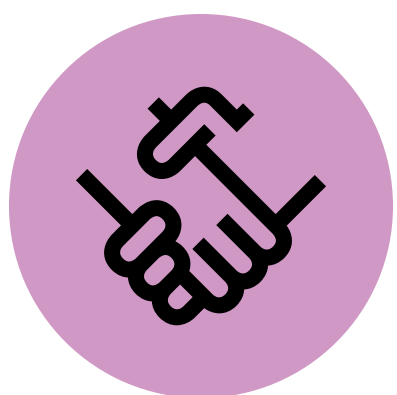

### Broadway scheme

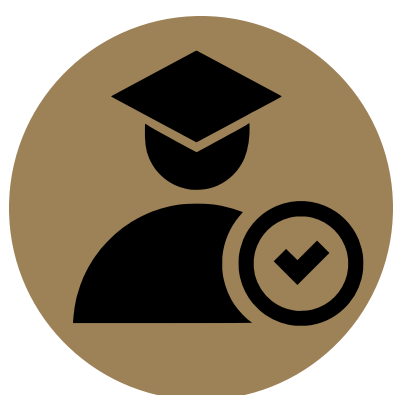
Apply for late consideration via the Universities Admissions Centre (UAC) if you experienced significant disadvantage during Year 12.
