Donna has worked in Aboriginal affairs, Government and community organisations in Sydney for the past 35 years (mostly in education). She was also elected to represent her community as a Councillor on the former Sydney Regional Council of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Commission (ATSIC).

Donna holds a Diploma in Aboriginal Community Development and is a Graduate of the Indigenous Women's [Leadership Development Program](#). Donna is involved in several community consultation groups especially in regards to women's issues and NAIDOC week in the Redfern/inner city area. She is often called upon for advisory panels and community consultation groups. Donna was recently nominated to the Board of Moogahlin Performing Arts, a role she is very much looking forward to.

Donna has presented Welcome to Country at many conferences and major events in Sydney for the past 8 years. Donna also runs '**Redfern, Then and Now**' Aboriginal history walks of the Redfern area, which highlights the political and social history of Aboriginal people in Redfern and their deep connections to the area.
