10.30 – 12.30	Welcome Session: Introduction to Australian History, Culture and Politics Dr Justine Greenwood This session will provide an overview of Australian history pre-1788 to the early 21st century. The first section on ‘Early Australia’ will discuss the history of European and Asian contact with Australia prior to British colonisation. A particular focus will be the long and ongoing occupation of the continent by Aboriginal Australians and the impact of the British arrival in 1788. The second section ‘Modern Australia’ will explain the development of the Australian parliamentary system beginning with the declaration of Australia as a federated nation in 1901. The main focus of this section will be on tracing the changes in immigration laws and flows in order to explain how Australia transformed from a white-British nation to a nation embracing multiculturalism.

Friday 13 July - Leadership Development – What is Leadership?**Venue: New Law Annexe Seminar Room 442**

9:00-10:30	<p>Leadership and Ethics – Prof Kevin Lowe</p> <p>Effective leaders draw on ethical frameworks comprised of deeply held values to shape their behaviour while creating purpose and meaning for their followers. At the same time these leaders must seek to understand, appreciate, and be influenced by the ethical frameworks held by their followers.</p> <p>In this session we will explore multiple ethical frameworks to consider how the framework in use might drive different understandings of what is "good" and in turn how a common good might be achieved.</p>
11.00 – 12.30	<p>Identity, Leadership and Entrepreneurship - Dr Sandra Seno-Alday</p> <p>Our life experiences at home, at school/university, at work and in our different social circles help determine who we are as individuals. All of our experiences occur within a very particular socio-cultural framework that defines the roles that other people expect us to play, as well as the norms and 'rules' that govern our social interactions.</p> <p>In this session, we explore the ways in which culturally determined standards of behaviour and relationship dynamics shape our personal identities. We investigate how we consciously and unconsciously draw on our different experiences to construct and create our concept of self. Our unique emergent personal identities in turn influence the way we view ourselves as leaders, and how we choose to exercise our leadership.</p> <p>Finally, we explore how leadership is specifically manifested across a range of business and economic activities, and conclude with a challenge on exercising leadership through social enterprise.</p>

13.30 – 14.15	<p>Innovation Hub Session One: Creativity, Innovation and Entrepreneurship – James Meade</p> <p>This session will examine the link between creativity (thinking in new ways), innovation (the application of new ideas) and entrepreneurship (the commercialisation of those applications). We will explore the scientific basis of creativity, considering how context and structure may moderate creative outcomes.</p>

9:00-12:30	<p>Sydney Design Lab- Professor Martin Tomitsch</p> <p>Innovating through design: understanding problems and finding solutions Design is no longer limited to design professionals but can provide a strategic advantage across many disciplines. As a framework, design offers methods and an approach for dealing with complexity and being comfortable with ambiguity. This framework, also referred to as design thinking, allows us to systematically understand problems and to turn insights into ideas and solutions. This session will provide an overview of design thinking as a capability enhancing skill. Through short talks and hands-on activities from a design thinking toolkit developed at the University of Sydney, you will learn about the different stages of a design project and apply some of the methods used to solve design challenges.</p>

13:30 - 15:30	<p>Sustainable and ethical food systems through a Planetary Health lens Professor Robyn Alders</p> <p>Supplying adequate, affordable, ethical and safe nutrition for more than 9 billion people and more than 27 billion dependent animals predicted by 2050 whilst sustaining biodiversity are among the most important and complex of human responsibilities. Globally, many food systems adversely affect the ecosystem and are driving habitat, land and marine biodiversity decline through direct impacts. Human wellbeing is also compromised as a result of malnutrition and food- and diet-related disease. The growing global population and associated environmental pressures necessitate a realignment of agriculture towards more specifically defined human nutrition and food safety needs, providing sufficient nutritious food through well-targeted production in harmony with ecosystem services. This session focuses on options for achieving sustainable and ethical food systems in line with the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) within a Planetary Health Framework. Group work sessions will facilitate the identification of key issues relating to food systems in your own countries/regions and how the leadership of youth can contribute to making our food systems sustainable.</p>
