1 Purpose and application

- (1) These procedures give effect to:
 - (a) the Research Code of Conduct; and
 - (b) the <u>National Statement on Ethical Conduct in Human Research 2023</u> ("National Statement')
- (2) These procedures:
 - (a) apply to research conducted by staff, students, affiliates, or other researchers of the University; and
 - (b) set out the process for notifying the University of external ethics approvals.

2 Commencement

These procedures commence on 14 May 2024.

3 Interpretation

(1) Words and phrases used in these procedures and not otherwise defined in this document have the meanings they have in the <u>Research Code of Conduct</u>.

HREC means a Human Research Ethics Committee registered by the

NHMRC.

Note: See <u>Research Code of Conduct</u> for more detail.

international ethics review mechanism

means a framework through which human research is ethically assessed in another country, where University researchers or

students are collaborating.



lower-risk research

has the meaning given in the *National Statement*. At the date of this document that is:

research with no risk of harm where the only foreseeable risk is discomfort.

low-risk subcommittee

means a subcommittee of a University HREC established to review low-risk research.

myResearch Ethics

means the University's research information management application. It is used to:

- collect and manage information about researchers and their research; and
- manage the human ethics submission process.

NHMRC

means the National Health and Medical Research Council.

student

has the meaning given in the *University of Sydney (Student Discipline) Rule*. At the date of this document that is:

means a person who:

- is currently admitted to candidature in an award course at the University; or
- is a non-award student, exchange student or study abroad student enrolled in a unit of study at the University.

4 Projects approved by external HRECs

- (1) The University recognises the ethical assessment and approval of a research project by an external HREC.
- (2) Researchers who have obtained approval from an external HREC are not required to seek approval from a University HREC.
- (3) The approving external HREC is responsible for:
 - (a) maintaining oversight of the project;
 - (b) monitoring activities under its oversight; and
 - (c) any errors in the decision-making process about the project.
- (4) Researchers named on the research project must use the External Approval Notification Form in myResearch Ethics to notify the University Human Ethics Manager promptly of:
 - (a) the approval; and
 - (b) approval of amendment or modification to it.
- (5) Each notification must:
 - (a) identify one of the named researchers as the primary University contact;



(b) identify all University researchers involved in the project who have not previously been identified;

Note: Researchers only need to be identified once. After initial identification, further notification is needed only when adding or removing researchers.

- (c) attach:
 - (i) the approved external application, and its attachments;
 - (ii) the external approval letter;
 - (iii) any additional agreements entered into about the external approval process; and
 - (iv) any protocol amendments or modifications since the last notification.

Note: These include changes to or withdrawal of the approval, and adding or removing a University researcher.

- (6) The Human Ethics Manager may:
 - (a) accept the notification;
 - (b) request further information, and defer considering the notification; or
 - (c) decline to accept the notification.
- (7) The Human Ethics Manager will contact the primary University contact about any decision to defer or decline a notification, and any request for further information.

5 Projects approved by approved external international ethics review mechanisms

- (1) The Director, Research Integrity and Ethics Administration may approve external international ethics review mechanisms for the purposes of these procedures.
 - (a) Research Integrity and Ethics Administration will publish a list of approved international ethics review mechanisms at <u>Application process Intranet The University of Sydney</u>
 - (b) Researchers may request the Director, Research Integrity and Ethics Administration to approve an international ethics review mechanism.
- (2) The University will recognise the ethical assessment and approval of a research project by an approved external international ethics review mechanism.
- (3) Researchers who have obtained approval from an approved external international ethics review mechanism are not required to seek approval from a University HREC.
- (4) An approving international ethics review mechanism is responsible for:
 - (a) maintaining oversight of the project;
 - (b) monitoring activities under its oversight; and
 - (c) any errors in the decision-making process about the project.
- (5) Researchers named on the research project must use the External Approval Notification Form in myResearch Ethics to notify the Human Ethics Manager promptly of:
 - (a) the approval;
 - (b) approval of amendment or modification to it; and



- (c) addition or removal of University researchers from the project.
- (6) Notifications must be provided using the External Approval Notification Form in myResearch Ethics.
 - (a) They must include the same information and provide the same attachments as required for external HREC approvals, as specified in clause 4(5).
- (7) The Human Ethics Manager may:
 - (a) accept the notification;
 - (b) request further information, and defer considering the notification; or
 - (c) decline to accept the notification.
- (8) The Human Ethics Manager will contact the named primary University contact about any decision to defer or decline a notification, and any request for further information.

6 Projects approved by other external bodies

- (1) Projects which have not been approved under clause 4 or clause 5 must be assessed by a University HREC if the research:
 - (a) will be conducted wholly or partly in Australia; or
 - (b) is funded by the University or by a grant administered by the University.
- (2) If the Human Ethics Manager deems a project to be low-risk, they may refer it for assessment to a low-risk subcommittee.
- (3) If the research project:
 - (a) will be conducted wholly overseas; and
 - (b) is not funded by the University or by a grant administered by the University; the researchers must:
 - (c) comply with chapter 4.8 of the *National Statement*;
 - inform themselves about the local requirements for conducting such research; and
 - (e) conduct the research in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations, and codes, including other University policies and procedures.

7 Adherence to approvals

Researchers named on any externally approved a research project must promptly inform the Research Integrity Office of:

- (a) any alleged misconduct; or
- (b) breaches of the relevant codes, guidelines, and legislation.

Note: This includes serious breaches of good clinical practice (GCP) or the protocol for clinical trials of therapeutic goods.



8 Rescissions and replacements

This document replaces the External Human Ethics Approval Procedures 2013, which is rescinded as from the date of commencement of this document
